OSWEGO BEGINS FIGHT OVER LAKE LOG BOOMS

Public Service Commission Is To Decide On Case; Claim Of Right to Water Aired.

Residents of the Oswego lake district, supported by legal counsel, appeared before the state public service commission in Portland Wednesday to protest against the use of the lake as a log storage basin.

Claims were made that if the petition of the Oswego Log and Boom Company asked for permission to use the lower end of the lake for storage purposes, was granted, it would deprecate the value of lakeside property.

Prior Claim Sited The hearing, which began Friday at 10 o'clock, will continue for some time. The company, in its petition, claims that under state law any logging firm has the right of eminent domain over land adjacent to a natural stream.

Former Resident of Molalla Is Dead Mrs. Anna Helgerson, for many years a resident of Molalla, died at the family home at Eugene Sunday.

Storage Plan Assailed In addition to the residents, who are being represented by W. P. La Roche, the Oregon Iron & Steel company is objecting to the proposed storage basin through Attorneys A. S. Pattullo and Mark Matthiessen.

Petitions from more than 700 citizens of the district, together with resolutions adopted by the Portland Ad Club and the Portland Realty board against the proposed use of the lake, were submitted to the commission at the hearing.

Former Resident of Molalla Is Dead

Mrs. Anna Helgerson, for many years a resident of Molalla, died at the family home at Eugene Sunday. Deceased is survived by a number of children.

The funeral services are to be held in Oregon City Thursday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock, with interment in the family lot in Mountain View cemetery. The remains are to be laid to rest beside the members of the family.

Mrs. Helgerson was the only member of a party saved from drowning at Silver Lake, Wash., six years ago. In company with her son, Riley Helgerson, a daughter-in-law, Mrs. Bert Helgerson, and the latter's little daughter, Bernice, were rowing on Silver Lake, when the boat in which they were riding struck a submerged log.
