The boys of Saint Andrew's Guard held a meeting and adopted their new constitution. We print below the main items in the constitution.

The purpose of this organization shall be the encouraging and assisting of the boys of Oregon City in attaining the best things which make for good citizenship.

The business of the Guard shall be transacted by a board of managers consisting of seven persons, as follows: The Rector of Saint Paul's parish, who shall act as chairman.

Each member shall be assigned to one of the companies of this organization by the Director and shall serve in said company and be subject to his superiors in office.

The military officers of this organization shall be appointed by the board of managers, provided that no appointment shall be made unless approved by the director of the guard.

This Constitution and By-Laws may be amended by recommendation of the Board of Managers and the vote of a majority of Guard present at any regular meeting.
