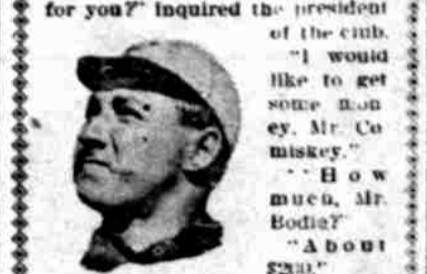

AN ORDINANCE declaring the conditions on lots 3 and 4, of block 12, County Addition to Oregon City are hereby declared to constitute a nuisance and a menace to the health and property of people living below said property by reason of the unsafe and unsanitary condition of the creek which flows through the same; and it is hereby declared the purpose of the Council to have such nuisance abated by building a cement drain to safely carry such water as flows through said premises and to make the same sanitary and prevent the overflow of said creek and the consequent damage to other property adjacent thereto; and it is hereby declared the purpose of the Council to proceed to immediately build such drain through said premises and to make the cost thereof, or so much as may be just and proper a lien against the said property, to-wit: the property above referred to or a part of the same through which said drain is to be built and now owned by Mrs. K. L. Newton.
