Notice is hereby given that sealed proposals for the improvement of Fourteenth street, Oregon City, from the west line of Main street to the east line of Washington street, will be received by the City Recorder of Oregon City, Oregon, until 4 o'clock p. m., November 3, 1911.

Plans and specifications containing further information and the kind of improvement to be made will be furnished upon application to the City Recorder. Each bid must be accompanied by a certified check for a sum equal to five per centum of the total amount of the bid, which sum will be subject to forfeiture to Oregon City in case of the failure of the successful bidder herein to furnish the required bonds and enter into a written contract for said work, if called upon to do so, within the time specified for same in the Ordinance providing for such improvement.

Proposals must be made upon blanks furnished by Oregon City. The right to reject any or all bids or to accept any bid considered most favorable to Oregon City is hereby reserved.

Each proposal must state the time required for the completion of the entire work for such street improvement, which work must be done in accordance with the Ordinances of Oregon City and the charter thereof, and the plans and specifications governing such work.
