

FARMERS TO THE RESCUE The Committee on Markets of the New York State Food Investigation Commission has made its report, which throws a little new light on the increased cost of living. By getting the goods in packages the consumer pays 40 per cent more than he would if he obtained the same things in bulk. The trading stamp adds 3 per cent additional to the price, and the practice of requiring the seller to deliver every parcel, small as well as large, adds 10 or 15 per cent more to it.
