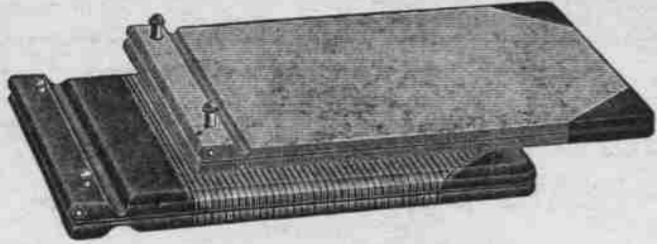

**BUTTER AND FRUIT TO RISE IN PRICE**

Approach of arm weather, and the need of stocking up storage plants with butter is said to be the cause of a forthcoming rise in the stuff folk spread on bread about July 1. Creamery interests say butter will go up about two cents a pound the first week in the first summer month, and will stay up until further orders. Raspberries are beginning to replace strawberries in the market of ferings, and are quoted at \$1.75 a crate. What is left of the strawberry crop is being divided between the canneries at a price not mentioned, and the open market, where a dollar a crate for eatable fruit is the ruling charge. There are some very good berries to be had at this price. New potatoes have dropped half a cent a pound, and are now being quoted at \$2.50 per hundred. There is considerable local crop being marketed. Asparagus, which has had an excellent run this year, is about at the end, and some poor stock is about all that is being offered. Cherries are being quoted in Portland at ten cents per pound, and in Oregon City at 7 1/2 cents. As a general rule earlier prices on new crops are lower locally than in the metropolis. String beans and green peas are

ruling low, with a plentiful supply, and with quality better since the rains.
