Fear of a General Uprising on the Rosebud Agency—Sheriff killed in Fight—Terrible Explosion of Two Car Loads of Dynamite.

Chevanne, Wyo., Nov. 1.—Governor Chatterton has been advised of a fierce battle that was fought late yesterday afternoon on Little Lightning Creek...

Sheriff Miller is reported to have been killed, one of his deputies fatally wounded, while three Indians are reported killed and several wounded...

It is feared that they have sent couriers on ahead and may arouse the Indians at the agency to action in case an attempt is made to arrest the murderers.

Governor Chatterton has instructed the troops at Douglas, Buffalo and Newcastle to be in readiness to be moved on short notice...

Owing to the fact that the Indians' rations have been cut off and the news is said to be in a serious condition in consequence, a serious outbreak is feared.

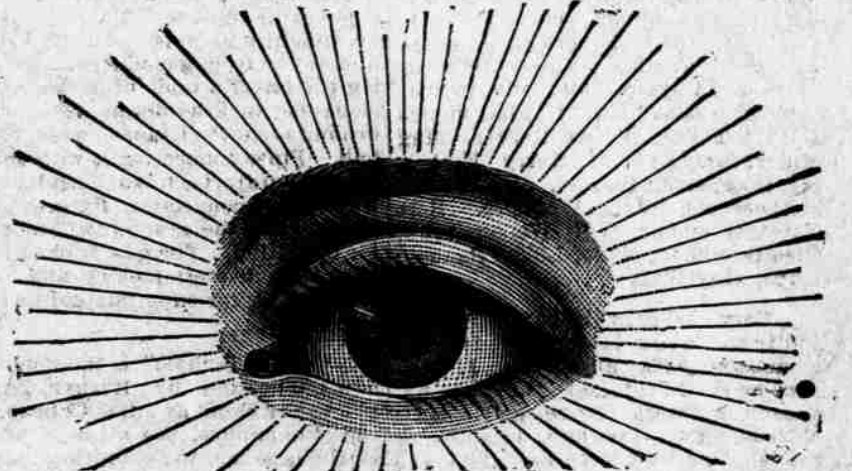
