

ABE LOGAN'S TRIAL.

Strong Evidence for Him—Tried to Save U. S. Grant.

The trial of Abe Logan, one of the Indians accused of killing Indian Grant, on the Siletz a few weeks ago, was taken in the U. S. court in Portland Tuesday.

The prosecution called many of the same witnesses who testified for or against Martin, who was convicted of manslaughter as his part in the killing, Martin's defense tended to place the entire blame upon Logan and the same testimony came in handy for the prosecution of Logan.

In the trial of Logan strong evidence in favor of the innocence of the accused Indian was brought out. Testimony was introduced to the effect that a consultation between Mrs. Albert Martin, wife of the convicted Indian, and her two sons, in which she is alleged to have told them that they would have to fasten the crime on Logan to save Martin from paying the penalty.

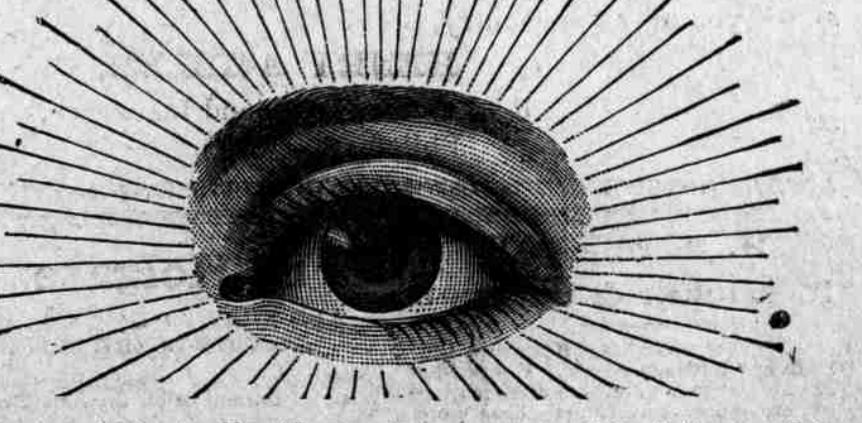
