owners pay the entire amount of their taxes before March $15^{\text {tht }}$ a rebate of three per cent is allowed,
but they can pay one half before but they can pay one half before
April $4^{\text {th }}$ and one-half October 2nd. If at least one half is not paid be-
ore April 4th there will be ten per
4t penalty and twelve per cent cent penalty and twelve per cent interest added.
