# Bulldogs win Final Four rematch over Gulls

SEASIDE — The Seaside Lady Gulls continued their tour through the top 10 teams in Class 4A basketball.

Having already faced No. 3 Henley, No. 5 Cascade and No. 7 La Grande, the Gulls hosted No. 1-ranked Sutherlin Saturday, in a rematch of a state tournament semifinal from last season.

And the rematch turned into a near repeat of the playoff game.

Sutherlin — which won the Final Four game 44-28 – posted a 46-33 win over the Gulls in Saturday's game, as senior guard Miranda Mendenhall scored 21 points for 11-0 Sutherlin.

Sixth-ranked Seaside will play No. 4-ranked Gladstone Tuesday, and will see No. 2-ranked Valley Catholic twice during the Cowapa League season.

By the time they hit league play Jan. 20, the defending league champion Gulls should be well-prepared to make another run through the Cowa-

"We've been running the gauntlet of good teams," said Seaside coach Wally Hamer. "It was good scheduling. It was the opposite last year we didn't play as many tough teams at the beginning. Hopefully this will toughen us up.

"The girls have really played hard overall, but haven't executed as good as we need to vs. great competition," he said. "In the last five days we played the No. 1 and 2 teams in the state. We need to play more consistently on offense to beat those teams and it didn't happen."

Seaside held an early 4-2 lead on two baskets by Maddi Utti, and a three-point play by Utti had the score tied, 9-9.

Sutherlin answered with a 12-2 run, highlighted by a pair of 3-pointers from Mendenhall, and the Gulls could never get closer than five points the remainder of the game.

Mendenhall had backto-back 3-pointers midway through the second half for a 37-23 lead, before Utti scored twice (including a trey), to cut the lead back to 37-28.

Kayce Mock converted a three-point play at the 3:21 mark for a 40-28 advantage, and the Bulldogs made 4-of-4

In this quarterback-driven league,

nothing could be better than teams driven by their QBs meeting in the playoffs.

So next weekend can't come soon enough: Denver's Peyton Manning vs. the man who replaced him in Indianapolis, Andrew Luck. Baltimore's Joe Flacco, who twice has defeated the Patriots and Tom Brady, heading to New England.

Aaron Rodgers against Tony Romo in Lambeau Field — just as enticing. Even Carolina's Cam Newton against another new-wave QB, Seattle's Russell Wilson, who merely won a Super Bowl last February.

"On to next week," Luck said after helping the Colts defeat Cincinnati 26-10 Sunday in the AFC wildcard round. "It's the playoffs. There's a difference. You've got to move on; you've got to keep that journey alive."

The divisional round opens next Saturday with AFC top seed New England (12-4), the East winner, hosting Baltimore (11-6), which eliminated Pittsburgh 30-17 in the other AFC wild-card match. That will be followed by defending Super Bowl champion Seattle (12-4), the NFC West champion, against Carolina (8-8-1), which beat Arizona 27-16.

NFC North champ Green Bay (12-4) is home for Dallas in the early game next Sunday. It's the first postseason visit to Lambeau Field for the Cowboys since the 1967 Ice Bowl. Dallas beat Detroit 24-20 in the wildcard round.

The final division-round contest next Sunday has Indianapolis (12-5) at Denver (12-4). Indy disposed of Cincinnati 26-10 in a wild-card game.

Andrew Luck threw for 376 yards and one touchdown, Daniel "Boom" Herron ran for another score, and In-
