## Warriors score best Pac Rim showing since '99

SEASIDE — There were three individual championships and lots of big points for the local schools this weekend, in the 2015 Pacific Rim Wrestling Classic.

The annual meet took place Friday and Saturday at Seaside High School, where 18 schools met for the biggest prep wrestling tournament on the Oregon Coast.

Wrestlers from the North Coast and Southwest Washington made one of their best Pac Rim showings in years, with Ilwaco, Astoria and Warrenton all finishing in the top eight of the team stand-

Topping the list individually were a pair of backto-back champions for the Warriors, Colton Walker and Rogue Bergerson.

The duo became the first Warrenton teammates to score titles in the Pac Rim in the same season since 1999, when Wes Balensifer (189 pounds) and Dusty McGrorty (215) won titles.

"We definitely thought we had a shot at it," said Warrenton coach Trask Bergerson.

Rogue Bergerson and Walker have spent much of the season competing at 113 pounds, before Walker moved to 106 for the Pac

"Colton has been shooting for 106, and qualified for it on his weight card," coach Bergerson said. "That was kind of the plan, to get them separated eventually. (Walker) got there, and once he did, we knew he would be really strong. It's been beneficial to both of them. They're helping each other out in a big way."

The team championship belonged to Class 5A Churchill, which scored 215 points to bring a three-year run by Scappoose to an end. The Indians (204.5) placed second, followed by Estacada, St. Helens, Ilwaco and Astoria.

Astoria racked up 110 points to finish sixth for the second straight year, highlighted by an individual championship for senior Josh Long at 152 pounds.



After winning the title at 106 last year as a member of the Astoria wrestling team, Walker did it again this year as a Warrior.

The junior pinned his way to the title, with four straight falls over Dalton Littleton of Clatskanie (:39), Dylan Coonrod of Central Linn (1:06), Churchill's Gavin Sherrill (1:23), and a 45-second pin over John DeWitt of St. Helens in the title match.

The Warriors had their highest team finish (eighth) since taking eighth in 2008, and scored their most Pac Rim points since 1999.

Parker Whitsett placed fifth at 132, and Michael Suppa fifth at 145.

Knappa scored 64.5 points for 13th, as Chris Cruz advanced to the finals at 170, where he lost a 10-3 decision to Churchill's Gavin Carroll. Nate Truax added a thirdplace finish for the Loggers at 195, with Astoria's Bronson Holthusen fourth.

Seaside had two sixthplace finishers — Gannon Abernathy (126) and Jordan Hansard (138).
