Lewis & Clark re-enactment on tap
‘Wintering the Pacific’ marks 10th year since bicentennial

LONG BEACH PENINSULA, Wash. — The community is invited to participate in three events on the Long Beach Peninsula this weekend. The first event will be the “Lewis & Clark: Wintering the Pacific” re-enactment, a new event celebrating the 10th year since the Lewis & Clark bicentennial commemoration shone a spotlight on Pacific County. The event will be from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday and Sunday, Jan. 17 to 18, and from

10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Monday, Jan. 19 at Veterans Field, located at 3914 Pacific Way in Seaview. The event is free to the public. During “Wintering the Pacific,” living historians in period clothing and full character will depict activities such as moccasin making, hide tanning, tent construction, trading and salt making. The re-enactment is an historical interpretation of the Corps of Discovery’s activities on the Pacific coast during the winter

of 1805-06 where they made preparations necessary for the return voyage. On that same weekend, the Ilwaco Sports Boosters will host its annual Crab Feed from noon to 8 p.m. at the Elks Lodge, located at 110 N. Pacific Ave. in Long Beach, and the World Kite Museum will present the annual Windless Kite Festival, an indoor kite-flying competition and performance from 10:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday and Sunday, Jan. 17 and

18 at the Long Beach Elementary School, located at 400 S. Washington Ave. in Long Beach. Lewis & Clark and Pacific County Newly uncovered history brought to light during preparations for the Lewis & Clark Bicentennial Commemoration pinpointed the Western terminus of the Corps’ voyage on the north side of the Columbia River, in what is now Pacific County — illuminating a piece of history that had been misinterpreted and overlooked. The significance of this discovery prompted new

ways for the public to interact with this important history. Among them were the creation of the Lewis and Clark National Historical Park including subsequent installments of Station Camp and Dismal Nitch; the first in a series of interpretive art by Maya Lin for the Confluence Project; the creation of the foremost display “18 Days in Pacific County” at the Lewis and Clark Interpretive Center; several interpretive sites at Cape Disappointment State Park; the building of the coastal 8.5-mile Discovery Trail; and the annual “Ocian in View” lecture series.
