The account must be funded with a minimum of \$25, and there is a limit of one match per baby.

At the end of the three-month promotion period, which expires March 31, any qualifying accounts will receive the \$25 contribution. Matches are expected to be made during April and will be confirmed as a contribution transaction.





Crash turns fatal in Astoria

A 75-year-old Astoria women died following a crash at the intersection of West Marine Drive and Portway Street in Astoria Tuesday afternoon.

Melissa Yowell, driving her 2011 Kia Soul, was attempting to turn left onto West Marine Drive, when she was struck by a 2008 Ford F-150, driven by Robert Carroll, 43, Milwaukie.

Carroll failed to stop at the red light and collided with Yowell's Kia, according to the Astoria Police Department. The crash occurred at 4:26 p.m. Tues-

Yowell was treated at the scene by Medix Ambulance Service and the Astoria Fire Department and transported with general complaints of pain and nausea to Columbia Memorial Hospital.

'At the time they cleared the crash, nobody believed it was a serious injury crash, much less a fatal," Police Chief Brad Johnston said. "She had been up moving around and was alert. Then we were notified by CMH that she had passed away at the hospital."

The hospital informed the Police Department that Yowell later died. The cause of her death is still being investigated by the district and state medical examiners.

No autopsy has been done yet.

As for possible criminal charges against Carroll, Johnston said, his department and the Clatsop County District Attorney's Office are still investigating.

Yowell's friend Diane Kazlauskas said Yowell was active in the community as a member of the Lower Columbia Preservation Society and a tennis enthu-

"She had a wonderful sense of humor. She laid it on the line and was a very enthusiastic person," Kazlauskas said. "She always kept busy, her garden was beautiful."
