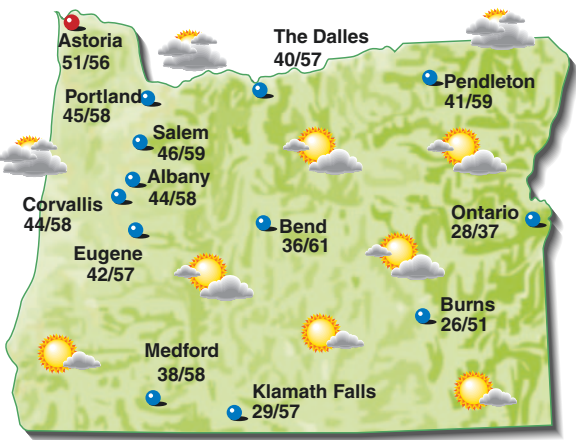

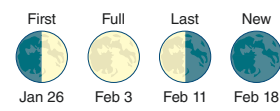

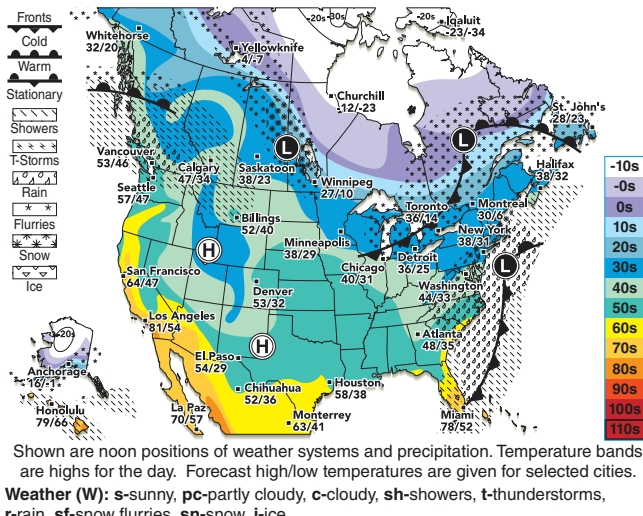

Ship-tracking now on newspaper websites

The Daily Astorian and Chinook Observer websites now offer ship-tracking reports in the mouth of the Columbia River. The interactive map can also be scaled in and out by the user to view other areas.

The interactive maps, created by Ship Finder, are available at www.dailyastorian.com/da/ship-watch and www.chinookobserver.com/co/ship-watch

Ship Finder is a marine traffic web application designed by online maritime and aviation enthusiast group Pinkfoot (my.pinkfoot.com) to track live vessel activity from across the world's seas and oceans. It displays up-to-the-minute ship tracking data broadcast straight from vessels equipped with Automatic Identification System transmitters to receivers showing information such as the ship's name, type, statistics, Maritime Mobile Service Identity

number, IMO ship identification number, destination port, estimated time of arrival, route and photos of the vessel.

Users utilize the app for everything from a ship-spotting to live boat-tracking for marine traffic awareness. Watch friends or family live on their cruise ship as they sail on their holidays across the globe. Indulge your inner maritime enthusiast.

Explore the site to its full extent and use the playback feature to view previous vessel voyage history; share interesting ships, boats and marine activity; and stay in touch with the latest in shipping news. Keep up to date with Ship Finder through Twitter, Facebook or by joining the ship-spotting community.

Ship Finder is also available as a mobile app on iPhones, iPads, Androids and Microsoft Windows 7 Phones.
