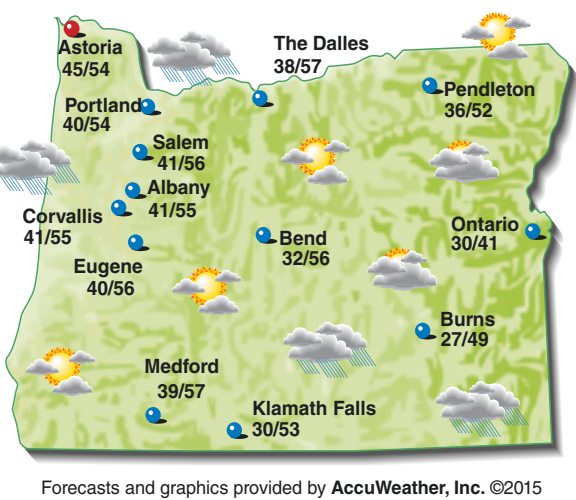

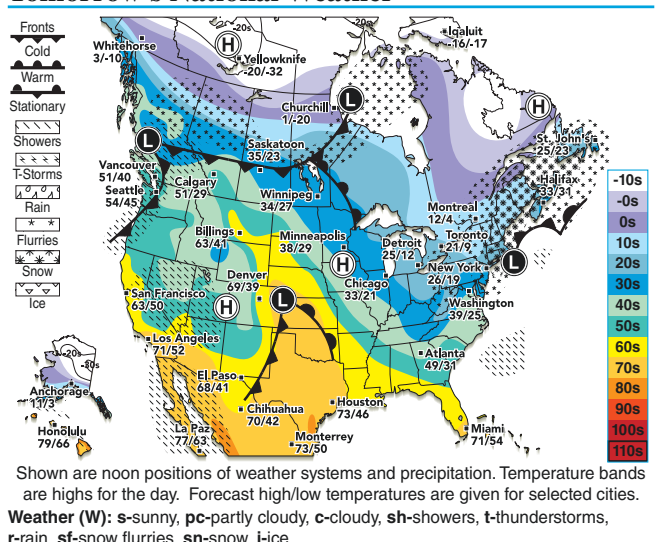

Melissa Ann Yowell

Astoria

Melissa was born in Baltimore, MD, the second of four girls born to Gabrielle vonPlan-ta Yowell and Joseph Wilson Yowell. She attended public schools in West-port, CT, where in high school she played three sports and was elect-ed best girl athlete in her class. She attended St. Lawrence University and earned a BA in History from the University of Connecticut. She then attended Katharine Gibbs School to secure some "practical" skills.
 Melissa was an East Coast girl by birth but her heart was on the West Coast, more particularly in Astoria, OR. In the early 60s she hopped in the little green MG TF1500 and headed west, first to Seattle and then to San Francisco, where she worked as a paralegal.
 In 1976, she traveled to Astoria for her grandmother's burial and first saw the home on 17th Street that her great-grandfather had built in 1890 and where her "Gram" had grown up. In 1982, while enjoying a full life in San Fran-cisco, she took a vacation, traveling up the coast to Astoria to put some flowers on her Gram's grave and take a picture of the house. She found the house shrouded in scaffolding, BUT for sale. It had to be hers and it was later that year. Short-ly thereafter she left SF and moved to the Mar-tin and Lilli Foard House on 17th Street, over-looking the Columbia River. While working as a paralegal, she ran a bed and breakfast on the weekends and became a Master Gardener. She loved her colorful and floppy Victorian garden.
 Preserving and improving her family home and her community were important to her. She had the home placed on the National Register

and it was selected to appear in the book "Amer-ica's Painted Ladies." She was active in the his-toric preservation of Astoria, includ-ing the Liberty Theater and the Lower Columbia Preservation Society.
 In 2013, Melissa was diagnosed with cancer and went back east for treatment at Duke University and to be with family. She returned to Astoria in February 2014 to continue her ac-tivities. She enjoyed taking ENCORE classes and was an enthusiastic, ac-complished and competitive bridge player. She enjoyed her bridge time with friends and was returning home from bridge when she was broadsided at an intersection. She died shortly after the incident.
 She is survived by two sisters and their hus-bands, Melinda Yowell Small and Raymond Rutan of Harpswell, Maine, Marcia Yowell Bingham and Tayler of Raleigh, NC; two nieces, Whitney Foard Small of Bangkok, Thailand and Somers Foard Killian of Boston, MA; three nephews, Sebastian Somers Small and wife Naomi of Brunswick, ME, Seth Harrison Bing-ham and wife JoEllen of Raleigh, NC, and Mat-thew Foard Bingham and wife Amy of Cary, NC; and three grand nephews and a grand niece. Her youngest sister Molly Somers Yowell pre-deceased her in 2008.
 At Melissa's request there will be no fune-ral or memorial service. However, the family is looking forward to meeting with her friends in the home she loved so much. 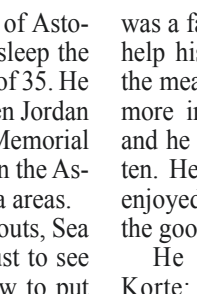

 Stuart's youth was spent in Boy Scouts, Sea Scouts and taking everything apart just to see how it worked, without regard to how to put it all back. He played tuba in the school band and played baseball, football and was on the wrestling team. His first job was delivering newspapers for The Daily Astorian. He loved camping, bicycling, and playing at the beach; most of all he loved spending time with people telling stories and jokes.
 In his teens, Stuart met Laura Pi-etila and fell in love. They had their first child, Steven, in 1997. During this time, Stu worked for Johnson Oil and later the mill in Madras. Laura and Stuart welcomed their second child Daisy in 2001. Eventually, Stuart and Laura went their separate ways and Stu moved to Portland. He worked several jobs, attended Clatsop Community College and then began working at Trails End Recovery and Custom Excavating. He joined the Seventh-day Adventist church and met Lisa Korte. They established a home together and enjoyed a rich family life. Lisa and Stuart were engaged to be married.
 Stuart loved family, friends and cared deep-ly about the happiness and well-being of chil-dren. He was an Astoria Clown and frequently handed out balloons and candy at parades. He

was a family guy and did anything he could to help his children and any other child he had the means to assist. He knew that family is far more inclusive than just biological relations and he extended that care and compassion of-ten. He loved the people in his town and he enjoyed making people smile, laugh and feel the good in the world.
