Lady Fish outlast Cheesemakers, 36-33

Tillamook's 33 turnovers proved more costly than Astoria's 20 missed free throws Friday night, as the Lady Fishermen hung on for a 36-33 Cowapa League girls basketball win at the Brick House.

Despite hitting just 10-of-30 foul shots, the Lady Fish ironically — clinched the game at the free throw line, where they scored their final four points in a 36-33 victory over the Cheesemakers.

The Fishermen improve to 1-1 in league play, 8-8 overall. Astoria's Taylor Mickle helped the Lady Fish to a 12-7 lead early in the second quarter, as she scored all of her team-

high 12 points in the first half. Tillamook closed the second quarter on a 12-7 to run to force a 19-19 halftime tie.

The Lady Mooks led 27-22 early in the fourth, but Astoria's Alexis Wallace and Chloee Hunt both scored on layups, and Hunt drained the biggest basket of the quarter a 3-pointer with 2:25 left that gave Astoria a 30-28 lead.

Wallace scored on an offensive rebound (Astoria had 17 offensive rebounds, 10 by Wallace), and the Lady Fish made 4-of-9 free throws in the final 1:31 to clinch the win.

Tillamook was 4-of-7 at the free throw line for the game, while Hunt scored eight of her 10 points in the fourth quarter.

Seaside 44, Banks 30

BANKS — Seaside shot 63 percent from the field and cruised to its fifth straight win Friday night, 44-30, in Cowapa League girls basketball action at Banks.

The Gulls were 19-of-30 from the floor, and even knocked down 4-of-9 from the 3-point line (although they were only 2-of-8 at the free throw line).

Maddi Utti scored 15 points and Sydney Villegas added 13 for Seaside, which held a 25-14 lead at halftime.

Utti also had five rebounds and five assists, and Villegas had four steals.

The Gulls "Made our shots tonight and played good defense and rebounded well." said coach Wally Hamer. "Brittany West came off the bench to give us a big lift on defense and rebounding, as did Paige Ideue. Great effort by every one of our starters.

"We got kind of tired in the fourth and hadn't scored for awhile, and Maddi hit a clutch two and a clutch three to get us going again," he said.

In addition, "I really love how Whitney Westerholm has become a complete player," Hamer said. "She can run our offense and plays great defense. Syd and Haylee left all out on the floor and Allison (Bussert) has played really consistently in every aspect of the game.'
