Loggers are red hot and rollin' in NWL basketball

KNAPPA — The Northwest League's big Tuesday night showdown turned out pretty much like all the rest involving the Knappa boys basketball team — a blowout victory for the Loggers.

Senior Tyson Burnard and freshman Dale Takalo combined for 45 points, and the Loggers stormed past Faith Bible 66-48, as Knappa turned a close game at halftime into another easy win.

'We were up five at halftime (25-20), then came out in the third quarter, played an old-school man-to-man defense, and blew them out of the water," said Knappa coach Chris Spencer. "We ran 'em out of gas, and they just couldn't keep pace. We brought the subs in, and they kept it up. It was a team win.'

Knappa has won six in a row, by an average of 19.0 points per game.

Knappa (7-1 in league play) plays at Vernonia (5-2) Friday, before hosting Delphian (5-3) Saturday.

Faith Bible was 8-for-20 from the 3-point line in Tuesday's loss, but the Falcons were unable to match Knappa's intensity, and had no answer for Justin Dragoo on the boards.

Dragoo pulled down 19 rebounds, including eight offensive boards.

Burnard Offensively, poured in 26 points, while Takalo added 19, all in the second half.

Seaside 38, Valley Catholic 28

BEAVERTON - The defending 3A state champion Valley Catholic Valiants are 1-2 in their new league, as Seaside cruised to a 38-28 win Tuesday night in Beaverton.

The Gulls outscored the Valiants 22-14 over the final 16 minutes, after a close first half.

It was Seaside's first meeting with Valley Catholic since early in the 2003-04 season, when the Gulls won at Valley Catholic, 49-46.

The teams played through four ties and four lead changes in the first half of Tuesday's game, finishing with a 3-pointer by Seaside's Jackson Januik that gave the Gulls a 16-14 halftime lead.

Seaside took command in the first minute of the third quarter on three straight scores by Attikin Babb, including a 3-pointer. Valley Catholic was within three points early in the fourth quarter, but never seriously threatened after that, as Seaside improves to 2-1 in league.

With hot hands from Whitney Westerholm and Maddi Utti, the Gulls fought back and grabbed a 31-30 halftime lead, with a 3-pointer by Utti giving the Gulls a seven-point lead before the Valiants closed the half on a 6-0 run.

Valley's Molly Danielson — who led all scorers with 20 points - gave the Valiants a brief lead moments later, but the Lady Gulls picked up hoops from Westerholm, Paige Ideue and Utti to close the quarter for a 47-45 advantage.

Two baskets by Allison Bussert and another score by Utti gave the Gulls a quick 53-47 lead to start the fourth, and the Valiants never threatened after that.

Utti had 19 points, followed by Westerholm with 15, and Bussert and Dundas with 12 apiece for the Gulls, who take over first place in the Cowapa.

Faith Bible held a slim 10-8 lead at halftime, before outscoring Knappa 16-2 in the decisive third quarter.






