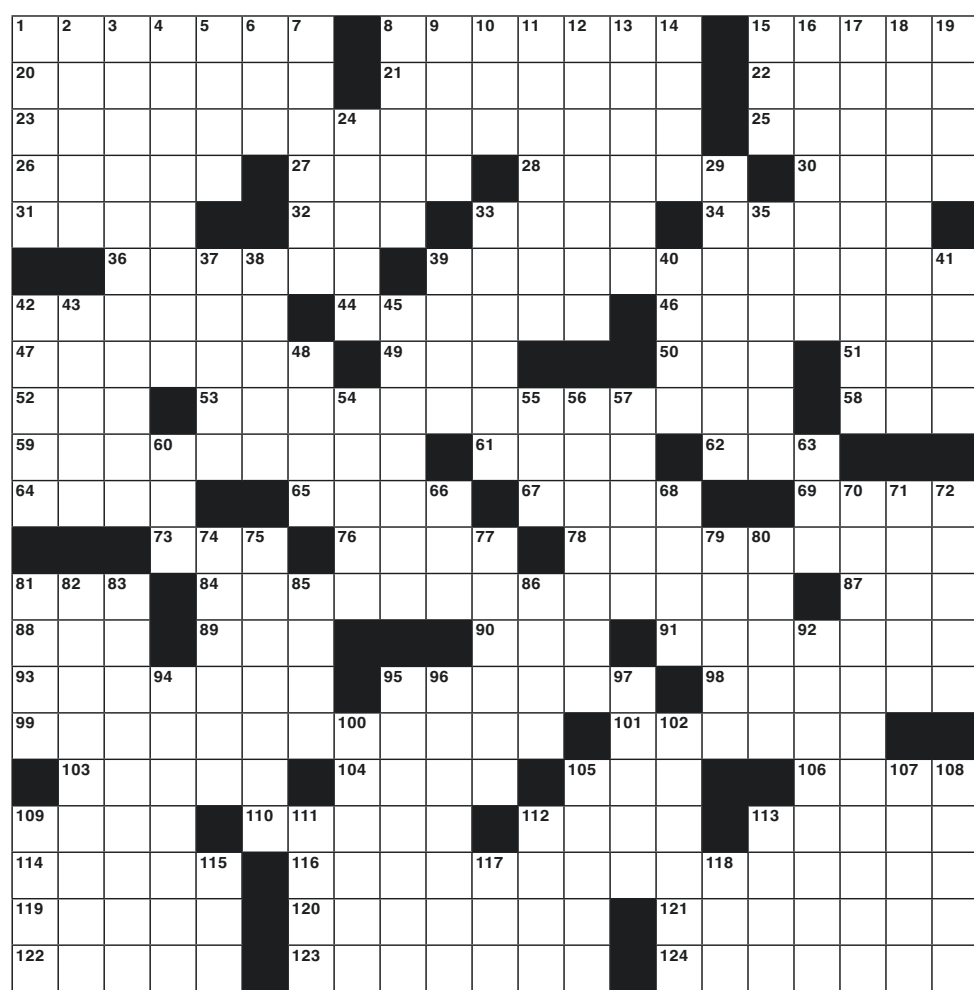

**Boleslaw Stanislaw 'Wild Bill' Marczewski Sr.**  
Ocean Park, Wash.  
Oct. 2, 1946 — Jan. 21, 2015



Let it be known to all persons that Boleslaw "Wild Bill" Stanislaw Marczewski Sr. has passed away on Wednesday, Jan. 21, 2015, at his place of residence located in Ocean Park, Wash. He was 68 years of age.

Bill was born in Dabrowa Gornicza, Poland, and migrated to the United States in 1964. Initially he resided in the Chicago, Ill., region and eventually moved to the West Coast. He made his way to the Long Beach Peninsula in 1981, and never wanted to leave thereafter.

He married Estelle "Marie" Hinckley in 1970, who is the mother to his surviving son, Bill Marczewski Jr., married to Deborah A. Marczewski, both of whom reside in Astoria, Ore. During his marriage to Marie he was also father to James Rueda (San Diego, Calif.) and Donna Rueda (La Porte, Texas). He later married Diane Depke, whom he knew from earlier days residing in Chicago, who currently resides in Long Beach, Wash. While married to Diane, he was father to Jason Scott (Chicago, Ill.) and Michele Scott (Vancouver, Wash.). He maintained active relationships with his cousins in Chicago, the Matelski family, and his cousins in Los Angeles, the Wartak family. He was predeceased by his mother, Stella Janikowski who passed away in Sherman Oaks, Calif., in 1985.

In 1969, Bill was drafted into the U.S. Army and served in Vietnam during 1969-1970 with the 1/50th Mechanized (Recon) Infantry assigned to the 1st Calvary Division. He was awarded the Combat Infantryman Badge (CIB) among other badges, medals and awards, which he was very proud to wear and demonstrate during Veterans Day. He was a Life Member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) and enjoyed frequenting the American Legion hall in Astoria, Ore.

He held various positions of employment that included: machinist/instrument maker for Pettitt Engineering (Los Angeles, Calif.); foreign auto specialist for A.J. Risley Imports

(Studio City, Calif.); owner at BHM Carpet Sales & Service (nationwide); refrigeration specialist for Jessie's Ilwaco Fish Company (Ilwaco, Wash.); and finally as harbormaster assistant at Port of Peninsula (Ocean Park, Wash.).

Bill's hobbies included daily trips to the beach with his dogs (all of them) to beachcomb for exotic wood logs floating ashore; picking wild mushrooms in the local region; and recreational crabbing and fishing in the immediate local area. Bill Jr. recalls him stating on numerous occasions that the local region of the Long Beach Peninsula is "God's country and that's why I'm here."

He was a devout Roman Catholic and never questioned his faith in the Lord.

His genuinely unique personality will be missed, but never forgotten, by those who knew him. He was well known for his exceptional sense of humor, good-hearted nature and support of others who needed assistance, in addition to his candid way of speaking to others. He made everyone one laugh, if not cry.

Thank you to all who accepted him for being himself and permitting him to do things "his way." He will be dearly missed by all the persons he touched during his life, and especially by his forever loving son, Bill Jr.

Michael Peter Riva, 74, passed away peacefully at home Sunday, Jan. 25. He was born May 10, 1940, in Hanna, Wyo., to Armas (Unk) and Myra (Waisanen) Riva. His family settled in Svensen, Ore., in 1947. He attended Knappa schools, graduating from there in 1959.

He began his career in school doing tree planting for the forestry. After graduation, he worked for Bumble Bee Seafoods (CRPA) in several capacities before getting hired full-time as a long-shoreman May 1, 1966. He suffered a major on-the-job injury in December 1970. After three surgeries and seven years he returned to longshoring, from which he retired in 1998.

Mike married Kathy Urell Oct. 13, 1961. They honeymooned in Lake Tahoe and Reno, setting the stage for many more vacation trips there. They enjoyed camping, road trips, cruising and playing poker. Mike also liked carpentering, and built a cabin on their private camping property. He

loved spending time with his grandchildren and great-grandchildren. He was a member of the Astoria Moose, Sons of the American Legion, and Seaside Elks.

He is survived by his wife Kathy; daughters Jamie (Jon) Bue and Mindy Riva; granddaughters Ashley (Jason) Kraushaar, Hilary Bue, and Megan and Erin Johns; great-grandsons Tanner and Tallen Kraushaar and great-granddaughter Abigail Johns McKey; sisters-in-law Vicki Westerlund and Robinette (Bob) Williams; and numerous nieces, nephews and cousins.

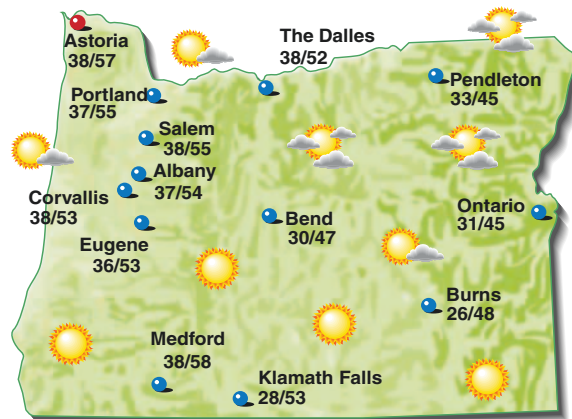
