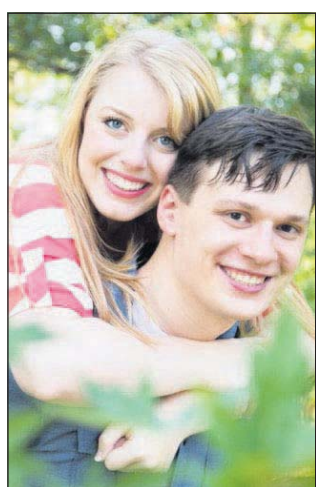
of the event, the regional food bank has collected 36,552 pounds of food at the doors of local supermarkets, donated directly from people in the communities, and over \$60,436
