Gulls sweep the basketball Clatsop Clash

SEASIDE — Take the last second of the first, second and third quarters, and that was the difference in the game Friday night at Seaside, where the Gulls scored a 55-46 Cowapa League boys basketball win over Astoria.

As time expired in the first quarter, Seaside's Hunter Thompson hit a shot from just inside the half-court line, and also drew a foul to complete a fourpoint play.

Seaside teammate Jackson Januik closed the second period with a 3-pointer at the buzzer and capped the third quarter with three straight free throws, after he was fouled on a 3-point attempt with one second left.

Three seconds, 10 points, and a nine-point Seaside win.

Outside of the buzzer-beating heroics, Friday's game was a free throw fest, as the two teams combined to make 41-of-59 foul shots.

Januik missed his first free throw, then went on to make 10 in a row on his way to a 20-point

Thompson finished with 11 points, while Jaxson Smith added nine.

Thompson's four-point play to end the first quarter gave the Gulls an 18-8 lead, before the Fishermen rallied and closed to within 20-18 late in the first half.

Thompson had another 3-pointer in the third quarter that pushed Seaside's lead to 37-22, but Astoria rallied again behind baskets from Morgan Fruiht and Derek Jarrett, with a bank shot by Fruiht bringing the Fishermen to within 46-41 with 2:41 left in the game.

Seaside answered with open drives to the hoop by Austin Eagon and Zach Marston, helping the Gulls pull away in the final two minutes.

Delphian 35, Knappa 31

KNAPPA — Delphian dialed up the right number again Saturday night, as the Dragons upset the Knappa Loggers for the second time this season, 35-31, in a Northwest League boys basketball game at Knappa.

The Dragons were responsible for Knappa's only other league loss, a 52-47 overtime victory over Knappa Jan. 9.

Delphian's Tom Chiang and J.J. Gonzalez combined for 23 of Delphian's 35 points, to help the Dragons snap Knappa's sixgame win sueak.

The Loggers struggled from the field, hitting just 9-of-33 two-pointers, and 2-of-13 3-point attempts.

"They played a decent 2-3 zone, and we were just not very aggressive," said Knappa coach Chris Spencer. "Maybe playing two games in two days (Knappa won at Vernonia the night before) did take a lot out of us, but we were flat and didn't play very well."

Knappa (8-2 in the NWL) still has a strong chance at the league title if the Loggers win at Nestucca (10-1) Tuesday.

Knappa's final three games are against Gaston (1-8), City Christian (4-6) and Neah-Kah-Nie (0-10), while Nestucca's final two games are at Faith Bible (5-5) and Vernonia (6-4).


