

Local teams score big in Beach Brawl

ILWACO, Wash. — The best wrestlers in the region met for the annual Ilwaco Beach Brawl tournament, held Saturday at Ilwaco High School.

And as the results showed, some of the best in the region are also some of the best among Oregon and Washington high school wrestling.

Several of the wrestlers who won in Saturday's competition will be favorites to win district and state titles in the upcoming weeks, as athletes from Ilwaco, Astoria, Warrenton and Knappa all had individual victories.

Castle Rock won the 20-team event with 211.5 points, with Ilwaco (170.5) placing second.

Astoria (133.3) was fifth, followed closely by Warrenton (123.5, tied for seventh) and Knappa (111, ninth). Seaside finished with three points.

The host team from Ilwaco scored one individual title, as Riki Thompson won the championship bout with Ocosta's Matthew Hart at 132 pounds.

Three other Ilwaco athletes tied for third: Garret Petit (170); Brandon Sparks (182); and Matt MacDonald (285).

Scoring big points for As-

toria were Josh Long and Josh Raichl.

Long defeated Castle Rock's Shawn Godinho in the championship match at 152 pounds; and Raichl scored a victory over Dalton Yoder of Toledo/Winlock for the title at 220.

Astoria's Tristen Holiday tied for third at 145.

No team had more individual championships than Warrenton.

The Warriors have been dominating the lower weights all season, as they did again Saturday.

Colton Walker won the title at 113 pounds over Ocosta's Sam Quinby; and Warrenton teammate Rogue Bergerson

defeated Ocosta's Conner Mal-
aben for the championship at 120.

Warrenton's Michael Suppa picked up the third title for the Warriors, defeating R.A. Long's Richard Clark for the championship at 145.

Knappa had top four finishers at four weights, with senior Nate Truax scoring the highest

Hawks' 19-game winning streak snapped by Pelicans

NEW ORLEANS (AP) — Anthony Davis leaped toward the basket, rising over a pair of Atlanta Hawks to corral an offensive rebound with his right hand and ferociously slam the ball through the hoop in one continuous motion.

That first-half play provided clear signs that Davis' recent left groin strain wasn't bothering him and that Atlanta's 19-game winning streak was under threat.

Davis finished with 29 points and 13 rebounds, and the Pelicans handed the Hawks only their third loss in 36 games, 115-100 on Monday night.

"They had us on our heels from the very beginning," Hawks coach Mike Budenholzer said of the Pelicans. "They deserve a lot of credit for us not starting well."

"Give our guys a lot of credit for a lot of good work over the last month," Budenholzer added. "Tonight wasn't our night. I am very proud of them. We'll get back to work."

The Pelicans won for the

sixth time in seven games. That recent run of good form has included victories over other contending squads, such as Dallas and the Los Angeles Clippers, and has pulled the Pelicans (26-22) within a game of Phoenix (28-22) for eighth place in the Western Conference.

"We just need to continue to do what we've been doing," Davis said. "The past couple games, we've been rebounding, defending, sharing the ball. We don't care who scores."

Jeff Teague scored 21 for Atlanta, but the Hawks fell behind by double digits in the first quarter and trailed the rest of the way, getting within single digits for only a few brief stints.

Eric Gordon scored 20 points for New Orleans, while Tyreke Evans scored 15 points and tied a season high with 12 assists for the fourth time in five games.

Asked if the Pelicans came in confident that they could end Atlanta's streak, Gordon responded, "No question. We're a good

team. We know what it takes. They're a 3-point shooting team. You've got to run them off the line. And for us, we're a tough team to beat when we're attacking and moving the ball."

The Hawks made only seven of 22 3-point attempts and were outshot by New Orleans, 50 percent (43 of 86) to 44.9 percent (40 of 89).

Omer Asik grabbed 17 rebounds for New Orleans, which out rebounded Atlanta 52-32. Davis grabbed eight of his rebounds on the offensive end.

Paul Millsap scored 15 points and Kyle Korver 12 for Atlanta.

"We've got a lot of season left," Millsap said. "So it's just regrouping. ... We can't let one loss turn into two."
