

AARP is holding three "Smart Driver" classes in February. The classes have new student guide books and videos. All of the classes are from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. and include a 45-minute break for lunch, and two short breaks. Those attending should come early to get the paperwork

These courses are designed for seniors age 50 and older, but anyone can attend. Oregon state law provides for a discount on auto insurance premium for completing this course. Attendance at the entire class is required to receive a certificate of completion. Most insurance companies require that a refresher course be taken every three years to continue to receive the discount; or every two years for those who are 70 or older.

Preregistration is required and seating is limited. The cost for the class is \$15 for AARP members and \$20 for nonmembers. Tuition is payable at the start of class, with checks made payable to


