Burglar in CAA jam theft sentenced

The burglar who stole homemade jam and other items Dec. 3 from Rogue Brewery's banquet room on Pier 39, uses as storage for a Clatsop Animal Assistant fundraiser, was sentenced to three years in prison Thursday.

Keaton Huff, 36, Astoria, pleaded guilty Jan. 30 to first-degree theft, second-degree burglary and felon in possession of a firearm after stealing gas, gas cans, food and personal property belonging to Rogue Brewery, the CAA and the Columbia River Maritime Museum.

The first-degree theft charge relates to Huff stealing jewelry, coins and a 30-30 caliber rifle Dec. 8 from a man living on Turner Road in Astoria.

Huff was sentenced Thursday in Clatsop County Circuit Court.

"There are actually several victims," prosecutor Dawn Buzzard said. "Mr. Huff went into Pier 39. He stole gas. He stole food from Clatsop Animal Assistance that was for a fundraiser. He stole from the Rogue Brewery and then he also stole from his mom and stepdad. There are a lot of victims."

Huff declined to speak during the sentencing hearing, as did his mother and stepfather. Buzzard spoke on behalf of Huff's parents and said they are both in agreement that Huff has a drug problem and being eligible for an alternative incarceration program will help him get clean and sober.

As part of his sentence, Huff will be in the alternative incarceration program where he will seek drug and alcohol treatment during his time served and possibly be released early if he completes the program.

He gets credit for time already served. Judge Philip Nelson ordered no contact with any of the victims. Nelson allowed 90 days for the prosecution to determine restitution.

Huff and Julie Brownfield, 34, Clatskanie, were identified a suspects through video cameras set up in the Pier 39 banquet room. Brownfield is charged with second-degree burglary and second-degree theft. She failed to appear in court Jan. 27. A warrant is out for her arrest.

Astoria Police initially contacted Huff and attempted to have the property returned in exchange for not taking him to jail immediately. However, Huff never returned the property.

Days later, Astoria Police learned Huff had been staying at a residence on Turner Road in Astoria and had stolen jewelry, coins and a 30-30 caliber rifle from the residence.

Huff and Brownfield were later found and arrested. Upon further investigation, Astoria Police obtained a search warrant for a residence at 102 N.W. Birch Ave. in Warrenton of convicted felon Albert Burkleo, 33.

Huff had sold the stolen 30-30 caliber rifle to Burkleo, who then sold it to someone else.

After a foot chase, officers arrested Burkleo for theft, felon in possession of a firearm, resisting arrest and controlled substance offenses.

Officers found three rifles, nearly 2 ounces of marijuana, scales, packaging materials consistent with the sale of methamphetamine and other evidence related with drug sales and the manufacture of a destructive device, a silencer, inside the Birch Avenue residence.

The 30-30 caliber rifle that had already been sold was later recovered.

Burkleo is scheduled for an early resolution conference hearing on March 6 in Clatsop County Circuit Court.

In court Thursday, Buzzard noted that Huff has a lengthy criminal history, mostly involving property crimes, which led to the prison sentence. Huff could have been sentenced to four years in prison, but his defense attorney negotiated it down to three years.

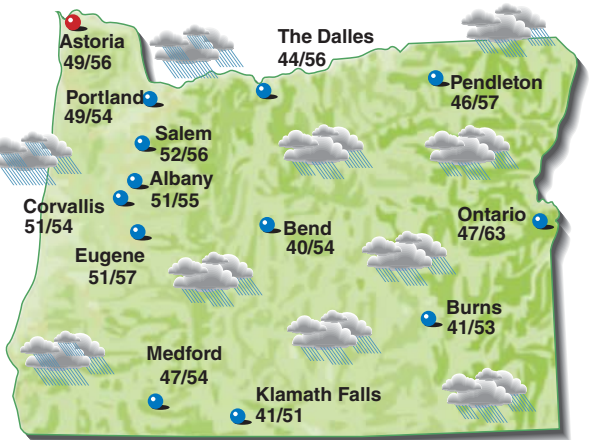

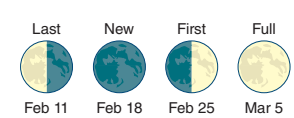

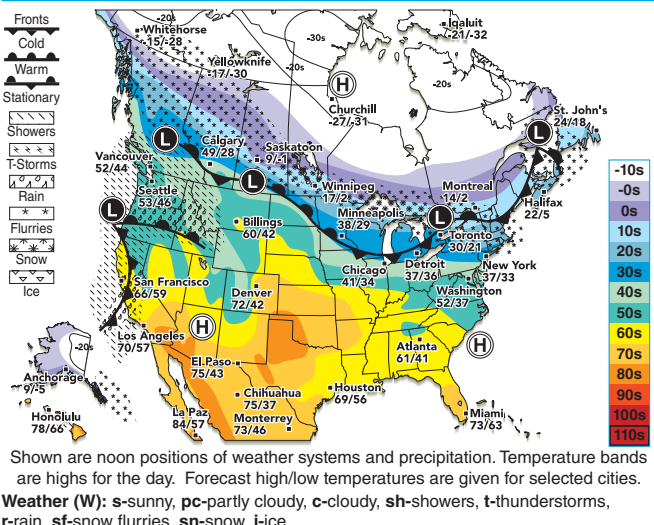
