

Clash: Seaside girls dominate Astoria in 50-29 win

found that if you have a bigger kid on Januik, he can't shoot over the top as easily," Goin said.

"And we had to rely on them missing some shots. They definitely missed some 3-pointers that they're used to making. But defensively we've done that to everybody all year. Our problems have just been offensively.

"This is the first time we've really executed a game at both ends of the court."

Offensively, the night was filled with big plays and big shots for the Fishermen.

Back-to-back scores by Jarrett and Ryan Palek had given Astoria a 27-18 lead with 2:55 left in the third quarter, before Seaside responded with a layup by Zach Marston and a 3-pointer from Hunter Thompson.

Big Shot No. 1: Astoria's Kyle Strange answered Thompson's trey with a 3-pointer of his own, and Fruiht scored shortly after to give the Fishermen a 32-23 lead going into the fourth.

The Gulls opened the final period with a short jump shot by Marston, and Astoria decided to slow things down on their next possession.

Jarrett passed up a wide-open look at a 3-point shot, and instead, the Fishermen were patient and finally got the ball to Fruiht, who scored Big Shot No. 2 — a backdoor cut that resulted in an easy layup and a 34-25 lead.

"That showed some maturity," Goin said. "I don't think we make that play a week ago. And against a team like Seaside, we talked about making them play some defense. They want to get up and down as quick as possible, and our advantage this time was inside, and making them play some defense."

Still, the Gulls wouldn't go down easily.

Januik buried a 3-pointer at the 2:32 mark, and Attikin Babb's trey with 1:19 left cut the Fishermen lead to 35-31.

Which led to Big Shot Nos. 3 and 4.

After Babb's score and a timeout, Strange hit Palek with a long pass on the ensuing inbound play, with Palek scoring and drawing a foul.

Palek missed the free throw, but Johnson gathered in the loose ball and scored underneath to push Astoria's lead to 39-31 with 1:11 left.

From there, Johnson made 3-of-6 free throws in the final 51 seconds to clinch the win.

Seaside 50, Astoria 29

In the Clatsop Clash girls' game, it was a closer score than the first time around, with the same winner.

Seaside built a 19-point half-time lead Tuesday night, on its way

to a 50-29 victory. The Gulls won the first meeting, 59-20.

Haylee Dundas led a trio of Seaside players in double figures with 14, followed by Maddi Uti (11) and Sydney Villegas (10).

Five points in the first quarter from Astoria's Chloe Hunt had the Lady Fish within 11-7 late in the first quarter, when Whitney Westerholm answered with a short jump shot that sparked a 15-0 run for the Gulls.

Dundas and Uti hit 3-pointers in the third quarter, as the lead eventually reached 40-14.

Astoria had open looks all night, but couldn't buy a basket in the first two quarters, finishing the first half 3-for-28 from the field.

Hunt found her shooting touch in the second half to finish with a game-high 15 points, to go with 12 rebounds.

The Gulls (8-1 in league) locked up a share of the league title with the win, and can earn the title outright with a win Friday at Tillamook (2-7).
