Knappa wins low-scoring battle with Pirates

KNAPPA — Basketball is a crazy game that doesn't make much sense at times.

The Knappa girls held a one-point lead at halftime of their Northwest League playoff game with Neah-Kah-Nie Thursday night. The Lady Loggers made

just two shots from the field the entire second half, and won by seven. Knappa's 36-29 victo-

The Loggers overcame a 7-4 deficit after one quarter by outscoring Neah-Kah-Nie 13-9 in the second, highlighted back-to-back jump shots from Wright and Cameron, and Wright's running jumper with time winding down for a 17-16 halftime lead.

Wright had a short jumper to end the third period, and Chloe Little made Knappa's only 3-pointer to start the fourth, giving the Loggers a 25-22 lead. The Loggers scored the

rest of their points from the free throw line. Stacey Aho and Little

both had eight rebounds for Knappa, which will be without Kaitlyn Landwehr for the rest of the season, out with an illness. Knappa can clinch the

league's No. 3 seed to the state playoffs with a win Saturday over City Christian, a team the Loggers defeated 56-42 last week.

"We'll just have to do what we did the last time we played them," Green said. "Play hardcore man-to-man defense like we did tonight, and hope their shooters don't get hot."
