Astoria Bridge work starts up again

Signs of spring are everywhere this week: birds chirping, trees in bloom, traffic flaggers and lines of cars on the Astoria Bridge.

Contractors for the Oregon Department of Transportation will spend the next four weeks or so setting up rigging and containments and doing touchup work in preparation for another busy summer as much-needed maintenance on the 4.2-mile-long bridge continues.

"These guys have a full summer of work," said Dave True, project manager for ODOT's Region 2 office which oversees projects in Clatsop, Tillamook and Columbia counties. The major work of

blasting and recoating the steel above the roadway on the bridge's main span won't begin again in earnest until mid-March or April and will through the continue summer.


By fall, though, Phase I of a three-phase bridge maintenance project that began in 2009 should be complete.

Phase II is next and involves painting all the steel under the main span as well as the two towers. It is scheduled to go out to bid in November and work would begin in 2016. Phase III, addressing all steel outside of the main span, will go out to bid at a later date.

Work on the bridge could continue into 2021. By some estimates, the Phase I stripping, repainting and replacement work alone will cost close to \$21.8 million.

2016 ODFW art competitions announced

Waterfowl Stamp art entries must feature one of the following species in its natural habitat setting: Black Brant, Common Merganser, Greater Scaup, or Dusky Canada Goose. The sale of waterfowl stamps funds game bird research, surveys, habitat improvement and conservation projects.

she volunteered and donated blood, the Miss Oregon Pageant, Seaside Museum, and many other civic organizations. She and Ed were also avid bowlers and golfers.






