

Public invited to comment on Seaside Mill Ponds project

SEASIDE — The Mill Ponds Technical Advisory Committee is seeking public input to refine its vision for the Mill Ponds park and to craft a recommendation for the Seaside City Council.

The committee is hosting an open house at 6:30 p.m. Wednesday in the Bob Chisholm Community Center, 1225 Avenue A. The

group will unveil its draft plan.

The committee already has taken public input received in August and developed a phased plan for the park. In addition to the public, the committee will seek input from the Parks Advisory Council, the Sunset Empire Park and Recreation District, the Seaside

Chamber of Commerce, the Seaside Downtown Development Association and others before finalizing a plan.

The committee's goal is to implement the plan this summer starting with invasive species removal.

Two minors arrested after hit and run

SEASIDE — At about 9:41 p.m. Saturday, Seaside Police officers responded to a motor vehicle accident near 220 North Downing St.

Jose Alberto Lizardi-Aguilar, 19, was arrested on charges of hit and run with property damage, reckless driving, hit and run with injury to passengers and himself, two charges of reckless endangerment, assault in the third degree,

two charges of alluding a police officer, minor in possession, driving uninsured, driving without privileges or with restrictions, improper lighting equipment and driving under the influence of intoxicants.

Besides Lizardi-Aguilar, there were two passengers in the vehicle. One of the passengers, Max Wesley Huddleston, 19, also was arrested on charges of fail-

ure to perform the duties of a witness, two charges of criminal mischief, minor in possession, possession of marijuana and unlawful possession of a weapon.

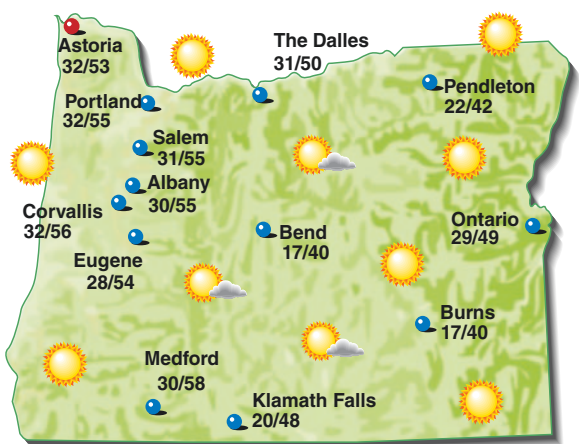

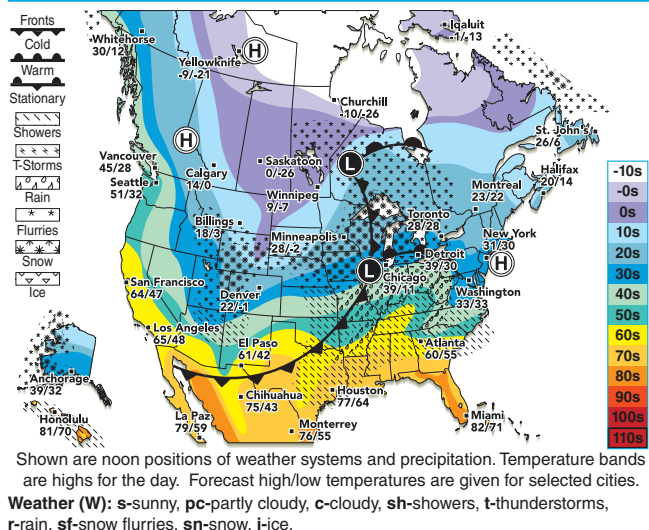

Nehalem Bay cleanup Saturday

WHEELER — Community partners Lower Nehalem Community Trust, Lower Nehalem Watershed Council, Nehalem Bay State Park, North Coast Land Conservancy, and CARTM, are joined this year by SOLVE for the ninth biennial Nehalem Bay and Estuary Cleanup, which takes place Saturday.

Orientation is at 7:30 a.m. at Wheeler Waterfront Park, U.S. Highway 101 in Wheeler, rain or shine. Participants should bring their own drinking water and sack lunch, and wear waterproof boots, gloves, and layers as needed.

A new addition this year is the family-friendly cleanup site in Nehalem Bay State Park, led by park ranger Shelley Parker, which includes family activities and hands-

on education. Also, science educator Peter Walczak is leading a youth crew cleaning up marine debris at the state park jetty. Youth and family volunteers can join the 7:30 a.m. orientation in Wheeler, or go directly to the boat ramp in Nehalem Bay State Park at 8:30 a.m., where there will be an orientation.

Volunteers should also bring a dry change of clothes for the party after the cleanup, from 3:30 to 6:30 p.m. upstairs at the Tsunami Bar & Grill, 389 Marine Drive in Wheeler. There will be live music, a chili and cornbread feast, root beer floats, and socializing.
