Clatsop County offering prescription card program

Clatsop County recently joined a new program to help residents manage the cost of prescription medications.

The county has partnered with the National Association of Counties (NACo) to provide a free Prescription Discount Card program to residents. The card can save an average of 24 percent off the retail price of prescription medications.

The card is available for use regardless of age or income, according to the county, and can be used by those who do not have insurance or who have pre- nacorx.org. Residents can scriptions not covered by insurance.

In addition, the card can be used to save money on some pet medications.

The card is accepted at 65,000 pharmacies nationwide including all the major chains like Wal-Mart, CVS/ pharmacy, Walgreens, Giant, Safeway and Rite Aid.

Participating pharmacies also include the majority of community-based, independent pharmacies.


