LINCOLN CITY — The results are in for the sixth annual Jambalaya Cook-Off in Lincoln City Feb. 21. First place and the People's Choice Award went to Sweet Basil's Cafe of Cannon Beach, Chinook Winds Casino Resort in Lincoln City took second place, and third place went to Roadhouse 101 in Lincoln City. The Mayor's Award went to Chinook Winds Casino Resort. In all five restaurants competed, three from Lincoln City, one from Vancouver, Wash., and Sweet Basil's.

Judges were Chef Bob Pounding, founder of the Culinary Center and owner and chef of the Blackfish Café in Lincoln City; Scott Salmons, a local chiropractor in Depoe Bay (since 1991) and a Louisiana native; and Mayor Don Williams, a longtime cook-off participant, competing and winning as the former owner of Nelscott Café.

# Oscar B makes first run Thursday

WESTPORT — Wahkiakum County's new ferry, the Oscar B, made its first run at 1 p.m. Thursday.

The new ferry between Puget Island, Wash. and Westport had to wait nearly a week for an issue with a temporary ramp on the Oregon side to be resolved.

Oscar B arrived in Puget Island Friday, Feb. 27, and passed a Coast Guard inspection Tuesday. However, the Coast Guard required another inspection for the temporary Westport ramp.

The ramp inspection occurred Thursday morning. The Coast Guard approved the ramp and the Oscar B started service hours later.

"Finally. It's a huge relief. It's wonderful to finally be operating the way we wanted to," Wahkiakum County Public Works Director Pete Ringen said. "Once I heard that our captain was satisfied with the changes made to the ramp over in Westport, I was able to get a hold of the Coast

Guard. It took them a couple hours then they said we are good to go."

Rates and times will remain the same as before with the previous Ferry Wakikukm.

An 8-ton weight limit per vehicle will be in place until crews finish the permanent Westport landing by May 1. The weight limit does not allow vehicles the size of semi-

Ringen said he is planning how to handle semitrailers on the ferry, which the original ferry could not fit. He is considering a possible time schedule for semitrailers and a higher cost than the \$5 per trip for cars and trucks.

#### CLATSOP COUNTY ROAD WORK

Next week, Clatsop County crews are performing roadway construction work on Gustafson Lane in the Astoria area; drainage work on Wage Road, and ditching on Old 77 Jewell Lane in the Jewell area; and working on shoulders on Old Highway 30 in the Knappa area.

Also next week the Oregon Department of Transportation continues work on the Astoria Bridge. The project involves recoating the steel above the bridge deck on the southern side of the Columbia River bridge along U.S. 101 north of Astoria.

The scheduled work includes installation of the containment structures in preparation of painting the remaining bridge steel above the bridge deck along with miscellaneous touch-up painting throughout the bridge structure.. Flaggers control single-lane traffic. Lane delays of up to 20 minutes are allowed anytime on weekdays and weekends.

Recoating the steel below the bridge deck takes place on U.S. Highway 101 at the Necarney Creek (Sam Reed) Bridge (Oregon Coast Highway, milepost 39.53).

Work includes the installation of containment structures and painting the bridge below the bridge deck. Flaggers control single-lane traffic from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. Expect delays of up to 20 minutes.

Bridge rehabilitation work is being performed at both the Old Youngs Bay and Lewis & Clark River bridges along U.S. Highway 101 Business (mileposts 4.78 and

The scheduled work includes reconstruction of the Lewis & Clark River Bridge, which is now closed until August to facilitate construction activities. A detour route is currently designated with signing.

Old Youngs Bay Bridge work includes installation of new access platforms. Flaggers control single-lane traffic during construction when work is occurring as required, which will cause minor delays.

The Oregon State Police enforces the speed limit through the work zone areas.




