# Valiants crush Seaside's championship hopes

HILLSBORO — The league with the most may also be the league with the best, in this year's Class 4A girls basketball state tournament.

Entering the tournament with three of the final eight teams, the Cowapa League is well-represented this week in Hillsboro, where the Valley Catholic Valiants — the second-place team in the Cowapa — could make a serious bid to prove that they're the best in the state.

After finishing a game behind Seaside in the league standings, the Valiants had the hot hand in a Class 4A quarterfinal at Liberty High School, scoring an impressive 61-30 win over the Gulls.

Valley Catholic — the runner-up at the Class 3A level last season — moves on the 4A semifinals, where the Valiants will face Henley Friday.

Seaside is bounced into the consolation round, where the Gulls will play Banks in another Cowapa League matchup at 10:45 a.m. today, at Century High School.

The Gulls found themselves in a deep hole early in Thursday's game.

Three baskets by Molly Danielson helped Valley Catholic grab a 10-0 lead, and the Valiants led 12-2 after one period.

Two 3-pointers by Valley's Kaylynn Bush in the second period led to a 19-point halftime lead for the Valiants.

Meanwhile, the Gulls went to the break in foul trouble, as Maddi Utti had four fouls and Whitney Westerholm was whistled for three in the first half.

A 9-0 run by Valley Catholic to start the third quarter gave the Valiants a 37-9 lead and all the points they would need.

Held scoreless in the first half, Seaside's Maddi Utti had 14 in the second half, highlighted by six points in an 11-2 run by the Gulls midway through the fourth quarter.

Utti also had a team-high




Seaside's Maddi Utti drives through the Valley Catholic defense for two.

eight rebounds and four steals.

Valley Catholic had four players in double figures, led by Danielson's 18 points. Emily McLeod scored 11, with Maddie Vinson and Noelle Mannen adding 10 points apiece.

Seaside finished 12-of-46 from the field (2-for-17 from the 3-point line), while the Valiants held a 37-23 edge in rebounding and forced 24 Seaside turnovers.


