

# Visit state parks for a 'free day' Thursday

## No Discover Pass needed for Washington parks

OLYMPIA, Wash. — Washington State Parks turns 102 years old Thursday, and visitors are invited to help celebrate by getting out to enjoy a state park for free that day.

With the 2015 spring and summer seasons just around the corner, the Washington State Parks and Recreation Commission reminds the public that there are recreation opportunities available in more than 100 parks, trails and recreation sites all over the state. Thursday is the third of 12 state parks

"free days" this year, when visitors are not required to display the Discover Pass to visit a park.

"These free days are great way for people to explore a new park or return to an old favorite," said Commissioner Pat Lantz of Gig Harbor. "Once people realize just what they have in Washington State Parks, we hope they consider buying a Discover Pass. Revenues from the pass are so important; they help keep our parks open and accessible."

Free days are in keeping with legislation that created the Discover Pass, a \$30 annual or \$10 one-day permit required on recreation lands managed by Washington State Parks, the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife and the Department of Natural Resources. The Discover Pass legislation provided that State Parks could designate up to 12 "free days" each

year when the pass would not be required to visit state parks. Discover Pass is required to access DFW and DNR Lands on State Parks free days.

The remaining 2015 State Parks free days are:

- April 4 — (Saturday) A spring-time free Saturday
- April 22 — (Wednesday) Earth Day
- May 10 — (Sunday) A spring-time free Sunday
- June 6 — (Saturday) National Trails Day
- June 13 — (Saturday) National Get Outdoors Day

- Aug. 25 — (Tuesday) National Park Service's 99th birthday
- Sept. 26 — (Saturday) National Public Lands Day
- Nov. 11 — (Wednesday) Veterans Day

The Discover Pass provides daytime access to parks. Overnight visitors in state parks are charged fees for camping and other overnight accommodations; day access is included in the overnight fee.

The Discover Pass does not replace the Sno-park permit requirement for use of Sno-Park winter recreation sites.

# Public Works open house to preview traffic disruption

## Sewer project gears up to tackle 14th to 18th street project

The city of Astoria Public Works Department is holding an informational neighborhood public open house from 5 to 7 p.m. Thursday at Clatsop Community College, in Room 219, Columbia Hall, 1651 Lexington Ave., about the

16th Street Combined Sewer Overflow (CSO) Separation project. Those attending will learn about the unavoidable disruption to the neighborhood that will occur during construction of the project, which is part of the overall CSO control plan designed to significantly reduce discharges of

combined storm and sanitary sewage to the Columbia River and Youngs Bay.

Construction is expected to begin in May and will be substantially complete by the end of 2015. The scope of the project includes construction in the following locations: 14th Street from

Duane Street to Lexington Avenue; 15th Street from Commercial Street to Irving Avenue; 15th Street from Jerome Avenue to Madison Avenue; 16th Street from Marine Drive to Lexington Avenue; 17th Street from Duane to Jerome; 18th St. from Exchange Street to

Grand Avenue; and Jerome from 14th to 15th.

Citizens are encouraged to attend the public open house to have their questions answered, and to become more informed of the scope and anticipated impacts of this project.

This project is funded in part with a financial award from the Water Fund, funded by the Oregon State Lot-

tery and administered by the state of Oregon Business Development Department.

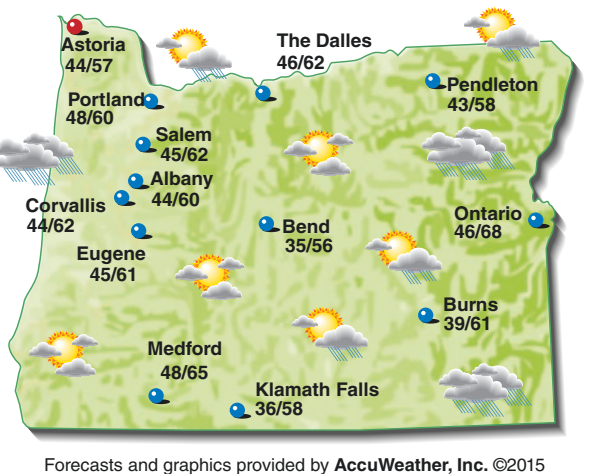

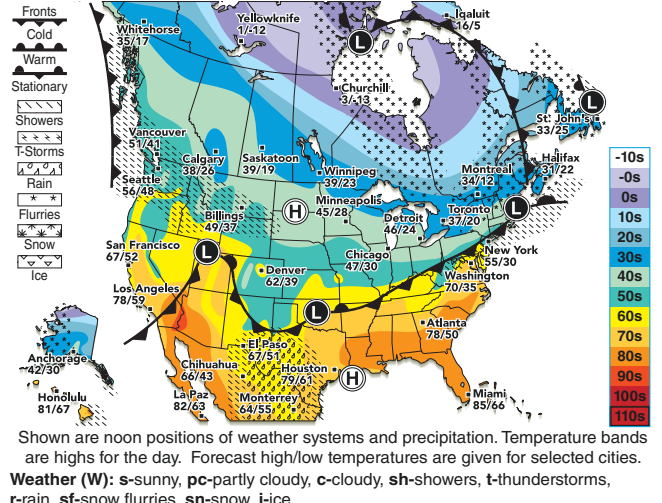
