Loggers get defensive in win; Fishermen down Cardinals

KNAPPA — The highest scoring baseball team in the state also has a great pitching staff, and — from the looks of it — one of the best defensive teams as well.

What's it all mean? The Knappa Loggers are going to be next to impossible to beat this season.

The Clatskanie Tigers have pretty much given up on the idea, at least for this school year.

After losing to the Loggers in football and basketball, the Tigers added baseball to the list of "stuff that Knappa is better than us at," as the Loggers defeated Clatskanie 6-2 in a season-opening baseball game Wednesday at Teevin Field.

"Our seniors have lost a lot of games to those kids over the years, so the kids certainly felt good about that one," said Knappa coach Jeff Miller, whose team has lost season openers to Clatskanie the last two years.

Although after last season's opening day loss, the Loggers won 28 in a row, and did not lose again until the 2A semifinals

"Clatskanie is obviously a good, quality veteran team,'

he said. "It's been a long time since we started a season with a win. Seems like it's been forever.'

Clatskanie's all-state pitcher did not last two innings against the Loggers, who scored two runs off German George in the first inning, then added another in the third.

Knappa had just three hits, but took advantage of 12 walks and three hit batters. "We have a ways to go at

the plate," Miller said. "We had some poor approaches there, but made them throw a lot of pitches, which worked to our benefit.

"To me, (the Tigers) kind of looked like we have against them the last two years," Miller said. "They have good pitchers, but they struggled throwing strikes, and that's usually us in the first game.

"Our pitchers (Chase Rusi-

novich and Tyson Burnard) were really efficient and did a nice job," he said. "I didn't think we'd get through that game with two pitchers. We had six ready."

The Loggers scored their first run on a bases-loaded walk, then scored twice on errors for a 3-0 lead.

Knappa added three runs in the fifth, scoring on two wild pitches and a hit batter with the bases loaded.

Offensively, the Loggers have work to do, said Miller, after stranding 14 baserunners.

But even with an offense that struggled, the Loggers will be hard to score on this season

Rusinovich pitched four solid innings, striking out five with two walks; and Burnard came on in relief in the fifth and struck out five with one walk

Clatskanie had eight hits, including two doubles and a single by Alex McCallister.

Knappa's three hits came from Justin Dragoo, a double from freshman Dale Takalo, and a single by freshman Reuben Cruz.

The Loggers had four freshmen make contributions in Wednesday's win.

"Reuben had a nice debut," Miller said. "Throws a guy out at the plate, made a diving catch in center, scored a run and got on base three times. Dale had a nice debut at first base and Mason Hoover looked nice at second base.'

Cruz threw a runner out at the plate from right field in the first inning and made a sliding catch in center in the seventh, which was followed by Rusinovich throwing out George at second from right field moments later.
