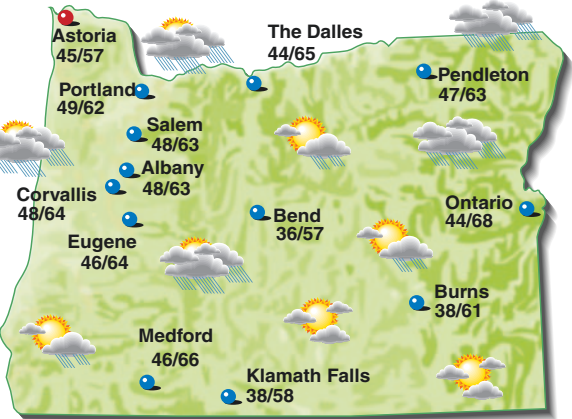

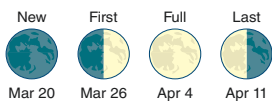

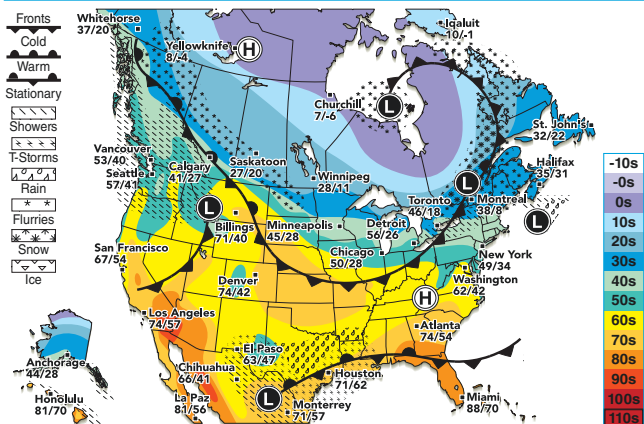

Warrenton Planning Commission wades into Oregon LNG project

WARRENTON — The Warrenton Planning Commission Thursday night considered a sliver of Oregon LNG's proposed export terminal: whether traffic conditions the city imposed in 2005 are still relevant to the liquefied natural gas project.

Oregon LNG has asked the city to lift the traffic conditions recommended by the Oregon Department of Transportation for Marlin Avenue because the firm has since shifted plans and envisions access to the terminal from King Avenue.

City planners have recommended approval of Oregon LNG's request.

Michael Connors, an attorney for Oregon LNG, told the Planning Commission that the traffic conditions were based on what is now an outdated aspect of the project. He described the

firm's request as a "housekeeping measure."

The new access from King Avenue will be reviewed when a city hearings officer considers Oregon LNG's development application in late May.

Opponents of the project, however, objected to the firm's request.

Dan Serres, the conservation director for Columbia Riverkeeper, a Hood River-based environmental group, questioned whether Oregon LNG can make the request without authorization from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

Oregon LNG and the Army Corps are in federal court over an easement the Corps claims on the Skipanon Peninsula. The firm did get authorization from the state, the Port of Astoria and a private landowner along the peninsula.

Serres also questioned whether Oregon LNG has addressed how the transportation

plan for the project would impact a 100-foot right of way known as Road 300.

After a public request, the Planning Commission extended the hearing to allow more time for written testimony. The hearing is expected to resume April 9.

The Planning Commission will make a recommendation to the City Commission, which will make a final decision, as well as hear any appeal from the ruling by the hearings officer on the development application.

Oregon LNG has proposed an export terminal to connect natural gas from Western Canada and the Rockies to markets in Asia. The \$6 billion project includes an 87-mile pipeline between Washington state and Oregon.

Environmentalists, fishermen and many residents have opposed the project as a threat to the Columbia River and a risk to residents in Warrenton and Astoria in the event of an explosion.
