

# Astoria Column to be lit for sexual assault awareness

The Harbor, the domestic and sexual violence resource center for Clatsop County, is hosting a lighting ceremony at the Astoria Column in honor of sexual assault awareness month in April.

The Astoria Column will be lit with teal lights through April.

The lighting ceremony will take place at 5 p.m. Friday. It is sponsored by the city of Astoria, Clatsop County Domestic Violence Council and The Harbor.

Speakers at the ceremony will include Astoria Mayor Arline LaMear, U.S. Coast Guard Commander Capt. Dan Travers and CCDVC member and Choices Counseling therapist Christine Cose. This free event is open to the public.

Community members are encouraged to reflect on ways they can personally promote healthy relationships and build a supportive community for survivors.

According to The Harbor, one in six boys and one in four girls experience a sexual assault before the age 18. In addition, one in five women and one in 71 men will be raped at some point in their lives.

Community members can work to prevent sexual violence by establishing healthy and positive relationships that are based on respect, safety and equality and take action to

raise awareness among others, speak out against all forms of sexual violence, and encourage the positive actions of others including seeking help, according to The Harbor.

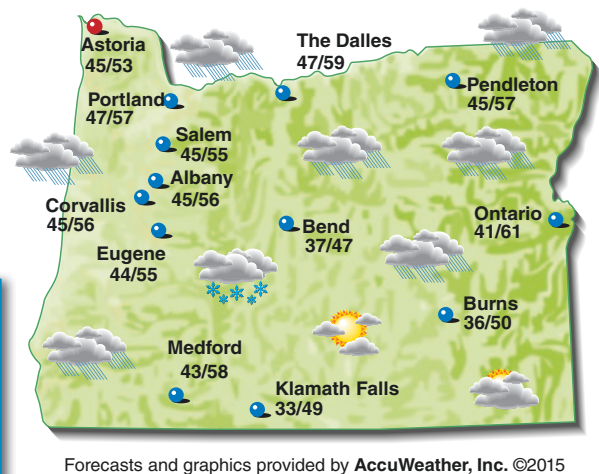

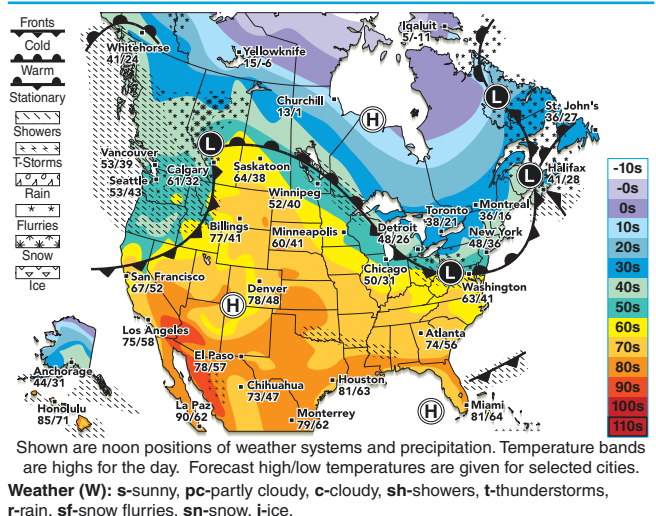

### Maryon Whitten Greenough Gearhart

May 20, 1919 — March 20, 2015

Maryon Whitten Greenough, 95, of this day. She used her summers to gain Gearhart, passed away on March 20, 2015. Maryon was born in Portland May 20, 1919, to William and Marea Whitten. She spent her childhood in Portland, graduating from Grant High School and moving on to Oregon State College, where she graduated with a degree in home economics. It was there that she met Harrison Greenough, whom she married in 1942.

Beginning their life together in Seattle, he worked for Boeing and she at Crescent Spice during World War II. While at Crescent, Maryon had a radio show as "Maryon Bell," where she offered creative cooking ideas that dealt with wartime rationing. After the war, Maryon and Harrison moved to Gearhart, where they spent the rest of their lives. Harrison worked for the E. H. Carruthers Co. as they raised their children William, Mary and Thomas.

Maryon's great joy then, and throughout her life, was cooking for family and friends and all the neighborhood kids. She loved crossword puzzles, and had considerable success at winning contests of the era that required clever writing of slogans and the like. After the "nest emptied," Maryon began a career as a home economics teacher at Seaside High School, where she spent 17 of her happiest years devising new classes and truly enjoying her students, who remember her fondly to

a master's degree and, for several years assisted chef and author, James Beard, with cooking classes celebrating Oregon's bounty.

Maryon was a member of Calvary Episcopal Church and Saint Anne's Guild in Seaside for almost 70 years. She worked with the League of Women's Voters, was a Cub Scout den mother and was on the board of directors of the Seaside Library. She also volunteered with United Way, SMART and, with Harrison, Meals on Wheels. Maryon was a longtime member of the Astoria Country Club, where she enjoyed occasional golf, bridge and especially lunching with a group of friends nicknamed "The Deserters."

Maryon Greenough was preceded in death by her husband Harrison, and her eldest son William. She is survived by her daughter Mary and husband Jack Kerwin, son Thomas and wife Donna, and grandchildren Jennifer, Nathan, Nicholas and Sue, great-grandchildren Alejandro, Mateo and Sean, and great-niece Joey.

Services will be held at 11 a.m. April 11 at Calvary Episcopal Church, 503 N. Holladay Drive in Seaside.

In lieu of flowers, Maryon wished that donations be made to the Seaside Library, Calvary Episcopal Church or the Seaside High School Culinary Arts Department.
