# Hinton medalist in Seaside win

GEARHART — The Seaside boys golf team hosted Valley Catholic Wednesday afternoon, in the Valiants' first official meet as a member of the Cowapa League.

And the defending state champion Gulls got the victory — with their best team score in nearly a decade — racking up a 313 team score to Valley Catholic's 348.

The Gulls were led by Sam Hinton, who scored a 1-over-par 73 to earn medalist honors. Aaron Richardson was two strokes back, as the Gulls had the top two scores. Valley Catholic was led by Pacific University-bound senior Ryan Schmidlin, who finished third with 77.

Shane Fritter shot 79 for the Gulls, followed by Trenten Meyer and Kevin LaCoste, tied with a pair of 86s.

Hinton "went head-to-head with a D-1 prospect and came out on top," said Seaside coach Jim Poetsch.

"Sam fell two behind after knocking a ball in the water on the fifth hole, but two holes later birdied to even the score." Schmidlin birdied holes nine and 10, and the two golfers remained tied until Hinton birdied a 17 and then had a par on the final hole to clinch the win.

a good Valley Catholic team," Poetsch said. "This was a match we have been looking forward to since they beat us last year. To come out and shoot the best score that we've had in nearly a decade in a big match shows the character of this team."

Hinton said, "I was really excited for all the guys today. It was cool to see Aaron's hard work in practice come through in competition. Shane had a hard time with his ball striking but still put down a good number.

"For me to play well on top of all that is just an added bonus. We played well but I know every guy, when they walked off the 18th green were all thinking of how to get better. And that is what it is all about."

The Huskies opened the fifth inning with three straight singles, with Ashley Bowman scoring on a base hit by Sarah Estrada for the first run.

North Marion tied the score on a sacrifice fly by Ally Umbenhower that brought in Kyia Brooks.

And Harrington came up with the eventual game-winning run, when the North Marion junior raced around the bases for an inside-the-park home run in the top of the sixth.

Astoria had six hits off Harrington, while DiBartolomeo allowed five hits with three strikeouts and no walks.

## Freshmen athletes burning up the track (and field)

SEASIDE — The Seaside boys swept a three-way Cowapa League track meet Wednesday, scoring wins over Tillamook (96-49) and Scappoose (73-72) at Seaside.

The Lady Gulls defeated Tillamook (80-53), but came up short against Scappoose (63-75).

Seaside winners on the day included Josh Chesnut in the 100 meters (11.83 seconds); Juneau Meyer (54.54) took first ahead of teammate Taylor Barnes (55.44) in the 400 meters; Jackson Januik was an easy winner

in the 800 meters (2:08.34); Rafi Sibony ran a Seaside freshman record 9:34.61 to win the 3,000 meters over teammate Bradley Rzewnicki (9:42); and Will Garvin swept the hurdles (43.04 in the 300 hurdles).

In the field events, Seaside's Christopher Anguiano won the shot put (43 feet, 3/4 inches) and the discus (115-7), while Chesnut capped his big day with victories in the long jump (19-10 1/2) and the triple jump (38-6 3/4).

The Seaside girls had their share of victories:

Kelly Willyard in the 800 (2:44.64); Josie Smith in the 3,000 (11:35); Allison Kilday captured the 100-meter hur-

dles in 16.48; and the Lady Gulls swept the relays, running a 52.73 in the 400-meter relay and 4:22.03 in the 1,600-meter relay.

More wins in the field events came from Kirstin Lent in the shot put (27-4); Danielle Willyard tossed the javelin 106-2 and soared 32-9 1/4 to win the triple jump.

Hageman a triple winner for Astoria

BEAVERTON — Astoria competed in a three-way Cowapa League track meet at Valley Catholic Wednesday, along with Banks and the Valiants.

Team scores were not avail-

able, although the Valley Catholic boys dominated most of the meet. The Fishermen collected wins from Marcelino Ochoa in the boys' 200 meters (25.33); Lucas Caruana in the 1,500 meters (4:25.72) and 3,000 meters (10:17); and Thomas Tice in the long jump (19 feet, 6 1/2 inches).

The Astoria girls won 11 of 17 events: Freshman Kaylee Mitchell in the 800 meters (freshman school record 2:23.17, and the second-best mark in school history behind Mary Wollenbecker's 2:18.50); Kaisa Johnson in the 1,500 (5:24.59); Victoria Kee (17.72) and Jillian Ketcham (55.54)

swept the 100- and 300-meter hurdles, respectively.

Astoria won both relay races (times of 52.65 and 4:32.87); Halie Korff had two wins in the throwing events, with marks of 36 feet, 11 inches in the shot put and 104-6 in the discus; and freshman Darian Hageman highlighted the day with three wins for the Astoria girls — clearing a freshman school record 8-6 in the pole vault (second-best all-time mark in school history behind Rachel Gascoigne's 9-0); jumping 16-1 in the long jump (second behind Charlene Harber's school record 18-3 1/2) and 34-0 in the triple jump.
