



Janet Lee Parker

February 19, 1940 – February 23, 2015

Janet Lee Parker passed away at her home in Seaside February 23, 2015, four days after her 75th birthday.

She was born in Glasgow, Montana, the only child of Edgar A. and Helen E. Parker. grew up in Portland, and graduated from Jefferson High School in 1958. In 1961, she graduated with a degree in Dance and Drama from the University of Oregon, where she won the drama department's Outstanding Student Actress Award three consecutive years.

Janet Lee's father died in Normandy in World War II; her mother was killed in an auto accident in 1962. She was briefly married to Prof. Herbert Weinberg, currently of Colorado Springs, CO.

Janet Lee retired from Los Angeles to Seaside in 2001, believing that the climate would alleviate the symptoms of multiple sclerosis, from which she had suffered for decades. Few local people were aware of her previous history and many accomplishments.

Upon completing college, she played the supporting role of Sandra in the film "David and Lisa" and also appeared in the movie "Act One." In the mid-1960s, she toured internationally with Bob Hope, entertaining the military. She performed in numerous stage productions in New York, Boston and Los Angeles, and on national tours with several productions. Her favorite of these was "The Odd Couple" in which she played the roles of Cecily and Gwen with actors such as Tony Randall, Jack Klugman, Don Knotts, Art Carney, Gig Young and Orson Bean.

Television credits included the roles of Amy Marshall on "The Doctors" and Miss Jaspersen on "As the World Turns" in NBC and ABC Specials, as well as in other dramatic roles and many commercials.

In the 1980s, Janet Lee worked in London and Rome as consultant/writer for the British and Italian versions of "Sesame Street." She appeared on stage and television in 23 foreign countries and was fluent in Italian and German.

Her acting versatility ranged from Shakespeare to children's shows; her media from screen to stage to radio. She also recorded 107 LPs for the blind. She was a member of Screen Actors' Guild and Equity.

Janet Lee embodied the term "theatrical trouper." Despite her debilitating illness, she remained positive, fun loving and optimistic. A Celebration of Life will be held Sunday, May 3 from 2 to 4 p.m. at Seaside's Bob Chisholm Community Center. At her request, memorials may be made to multiple sclerosis research.

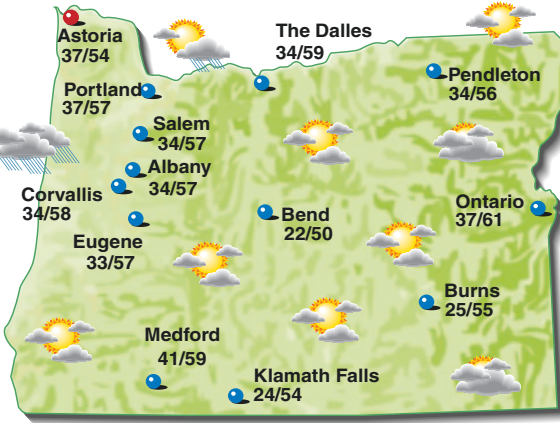

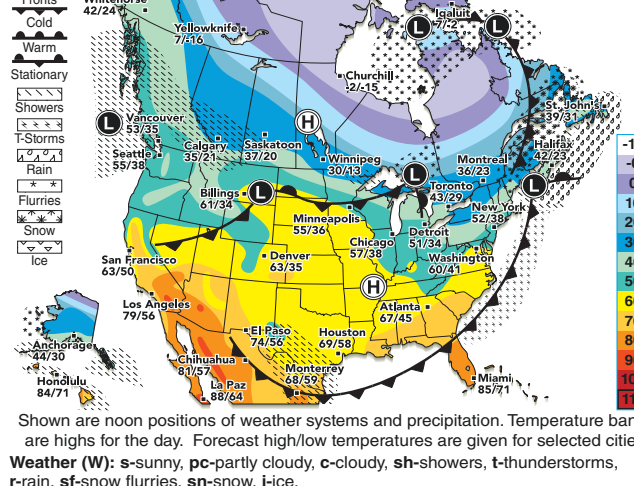

Jessie Rutter-Cothrell-Humble

Astoria

March 24, 1909 — March 27, 2015

Jessie Margaret Rutter-Cothrell-Humble passed away on March 27, 2015, in Astoria, Ore., from a life well-lived. She had just celebrated her 106th birthday. She was born on March 24, 1909, in a small cabin on her family's ranch near Susanville, Ore. Jessie was the youngest of six children born to Albert and Hallie Rutter.

Her early years were spent on the family ranch near Galena, Ore. In 1917, her family sold the ranch and began the 4-year journey that eventually led Jessie to Roseburg, Ore., where she grew up as a young woman. Along the way, Jessie took her first train ride, saw her first automobile and electrical light, and saw the Pacific Ocean for the first time. "That's too much water," she had said of the Pacific, the place she came to love the rest of her life.

Jessie graduated from Roseburg High School in 1927, and worked as a hairdresser. In 1929, she married Clarence (Buster) Cothrell. They moved to Cottage Grove in 1946, raising two children. Buster passed away in 1955.

Jessie was a member of the Presbyterian Church and the Order of the Eastern Star. During her life she owned and operated a freight company, was a florist, owning and operating her own flower and gift shop, and a bookkeeper.

In 1968, she married Leonard Humble. They lived in Corvallis, Mesa, Ariz., Eugene and Florence. He preceded her in death in 1985. For the last 30 years, Jessie lived in Woodburn, Seaside and Astoria.

Jessie enjoyed hunting, fishing, knitting, gardening, golfing, coin collecting, crossword puzzles, card playing, and crabbing along the Oregon Coast. She loved traveling the U.S. On one trip she drove from the Pacific Coast to the Atlantic, and back, making sure she waded in both the Pacific and Atlantic oceans at the beginning, middle, and end of her life journey. Closer to home, some of her favorite places to visit were Paulina and Twin Lakes.

Jessie's surviving family includes her son and daughter-in-law, LeRoy and Bonney Cothrell of Cottage Grove; her daughter, Mary Perkins of Astoria; a stepson and daughter-in-law, Leon and Carole Humble of Tempe, Ariz.; a stepdaughter and son-in-law, Alice and Malcolm Halvorson of North Dakota; a stepdaughter, Eunice Johnson of North Dakota; grandchildren, John Perkins, Steve Perkins, Robin Tubbs, Kelly Lanzarotta, Eric Cothrell, Scott Humble, David Humble, Paula Boerwinkle, Scott Schuetze, Stephan Schuetze-Coburn, Carissa Lewis and Janell Ginsberg; and many beloved great- and great-great-grandchildren, nieces, and nephews.

Preceding her in death were a son-in-law, Troy Perkins; a daughter-in-law, Janice Schuetze-Cothrell; and her siblings, Frank Rutter, Albert Rutter, Bernice Rutter, Edith Epping and Elizabeth Hutchins.
