Lady Fish open league play with a bang

SEASIDE — Nothing cures a five-game losing streak like a win on opening day of league play.

The Astoria Lady Fishermen put those five losses behind them, and they're off to a fresh 1-0 start in league, following a 15-2 win at Seaside Tuesday to open the Cowapa League softball season.

And you might say the comeback is complete for Astoria pitcher Libby DiBartolomeo.

After missing last season following knee surgery, the junior had her best outing of 2015, as she scattered five hits with three strikeouts and a walk in five innings.

For good measure, DiBartolomeo led off the third inning with a double and scored a run; then came up later in the inning and belted a two-run home run over the left-center field fence, the first of her career

"It feels good, definitely," DiBartolomeo said. "We came out to play today. We stayed focused and kept the intensity going the whole game. We got the bats on it, and played well defensively for the most part."

Astoria scored eight runs in the third, highlighted by five straight base hits and DiBartolomeo's homer.

"I've been working on it," DiBartolomeo said of her hitting. "I really dedicated the summer to working with hitting coaches and getting my swing down. So it felt good."

All together, the Lady Fish collected 19 hits, four for extra bases. Mykka Abrahams returned to the lineup and had two singles and a double; Abi Danen also had two singles with a double; Sarah Lertora had a pair of two-run singles for four RBIs; and Kelsey Wullger added three singles.


Taking into account where they were just one week ago, it was a 32-run turnaround for the Lady Fish - who went from a 19-0 loss to Rainier last week, to Tuesday's 15-2 win.

DiBartolomeo gave up 18 hits (seven for extra bases) in the loss to the Columbians, so the Clatsop Clash win feels a little better.

"I've played with and against a lot of (the Seaside players) for as long as I can remember, and that almost makes me want to get the win even more," she said. "And to get them back a little for basketball season." Rainier "is a tough team," she added. "They've got some great pitching, and offensively they're just crazy-good.


