

A few local senior athletes are signed up and ready to play at the next level.

The latest letter-of-intent signee is Knappa's Tyson Burnard, who signed to play basketball next season at Lower Columbia College in Longview, Wash.

Burnard was the Northwest League Player of the Year for 2014-15, and was named to the Class 2A All-State second team.

"Tyson is dynamic," said LCC head coach Jim Roffler. "He gets after it and he has the ability to drive and finish, plus he can hit the three. I think he will come in and compete hard against college competition." Burnard had a 50-point outburst in the NWL title game against Vernonia, the second-best in school history behind the 54 scored by legendary guard "Pudgy" Hunt in 1957.

Burnard also led the Loggers to the Class 2A quarterfinals where he scored 36 in a loss to Heppner.

Tyson has played against smaller school competition," Roffler said. "But the times I've seen him go up against players from bigger schools he has never backed down. I think he's going to come into the program and try and make a mark.'

In other letter-of-intent news, Burnard's teammate, senior Andy Miller, has agreed to play baseball next year at Clark College in Vancouver, Wash.

Earlier this spring, three Seaside athletes signed to continue their athletic careers at Northwest Christian College in Eugene.

Hannah Garhofer will play soccer for the Beacons, while sisters Danielle and Kelly Willyard will compete in both volleyball and track at NCC.

Garhofer will not be the first Seaside soccer player to compete for NCC. Soccer players on the NCC rosters last season included Bren Bletscher, Aaron Chesnut, Patrick Fritter, Ian Hawksford and Linsey Johnson.


