Astoria girls undefeated in league track

The Astoria girls track team put the finishing touches on their first undefeated league season, and the Astoria boys joined in the fun Friday afternoon, with a dual meet sweep over Scappoose.

Scappoose had several of its top athletes competing at the Wally Ciochetti Invitational in Cottage Grove, while the Fishermen had a few of their top runners entered in different events.

The Astoria boys won nine events, while the Lady Fishermen won 16 of 17 events.

Freshman Darian Hageman was a four-time winner for Astoria, as she soared to victories in the high jump, pole vault, long jump and triple jump.

Junior Halie Korff tacked on three wins in the shot put, discus (with a personal best 121 feet, 4 inches) and javelin, with teammate Taylor Cosner second in the discus and javelin.

Sophomore Natalie Cummings also had a hand in three wins, taking first in the 100 meters and running a leg on both relays.

Jillian Ketcham swept the hurdles, Kaisa Johnson did some speed work and won the 200 meters and 400 meters, while freshman Kaylee Mitchell ran the 1,500 meters for just the third time, and finished in 4 minutes, 54.95 seconds (less than five seconds off the school record).

As the Lady Fish head into this week's Cowapa League Championships at Banks, Hageman is ranked

first in the state (4A) in the long jump and triple jump; Mitchell is first in the 800 meters; Korff is ranked third in the discus and shot put; and Cummings is third in the 100 meters.

For the Astoria boys, sophomore Lucas Caruana won Friday's 400 and 1,500, and ran the anchor leg on the winning long relay.

Senior Nick Ketcham won the shot put, while freshman teammate Tim Barnett took first in the discus (personal best 128-0) and javelin, and second in the shot.

Knappa softball, baseball perfect in league play

GASTON — The Knappa Lady Loggers have made themselves one of the teams to beat in the upcoming Class 2A softball state playoffs — mainly because no team has been able to do just that since March 24

The Loggers are riding a 20game win streak as they enter the postseason, following their latest pair of wins, 6-3 and 11-0 Friday at Gaston.

Knappa fell behind 3-0 when the Greyhounds scored three runs in the bottom of the sixth inning of Game 1, before the Loggers staged a seventh-inning rally.

It was just exciting to see the girls come back," Knappa coach James Nichols said. "Even after we got down in the sixth inning, we had some girls who told everybody, 'Don't get down. Stay in the game.' And it was those girls who came out and got hits in the seventh."

The Loggers had four singles in their seventh-inning rally, "And after we won, Gaston was just kind of deflated for the second game," he said.

Jaden Miethe, Kaitlyn Truax and Alvson Olheiser had two hits apiece in the opener, and Stacey Aho was 3-for-3 in Game 2, in which Truax hit her first career home run.

Leading the way in Friday's sweep was senior pitcher Kacie Cameron, who pitched both games and allowed just three hits in the opener, and five in Game 2. She struck out a combined 17.

'It was nice to see Kacie experience the league title," said Knappa coach James Nichols. "She was talented when she was a freshman, but she was a little nervous then. She's come a long way."

Nichols said he was told it was Knappa's first softball league title since 1957.
