Knappa fishes on the Riverwalk

Thank Knappa High School for the large, painted aluminum salmon hung near the Port of Astoria’s West End Mooring Basin.

On Tuesday, students from woods/metals teacher Tim Kamppi’s class installed a large, metal salmon, which they fabricated. It was painted by art teacher Janet Hockman’s class. The salmon is painted in a rainbow on one side, and a Columbia River sunset scene with a fishing boat on the other.

Two of the metal salmon, quadruple-coated on polyurethane, were purchased for \$500

apiece at the Knappa Schools Foundation dinner and auction in February by commercial real estate developer Terry Lowenberg and donated back to KHS. The school approached the Port about placing the salmon prominently near its mooring basins.

“As Knappa, we’re so close, we feel we’re just as much a part of the community in Astoria as we are in Knappa,” Kamppi said.

The installation was part of a two-day May Days celebration for the students, who also cleaned up trash along the Astoria Riverwalk. Kamppi said that Knappa has done other cleanups in Astoria, such as the trail leading up to the Astoria Column.

Wednesday, the students went hiking, geocaching and fishing on Gnat Creek.

Hockman said the school hopes to get the concrete slab poured and install the second salmon at the East End Mooring basin next week.

Last year, Knappa’s woods/metals and art classes partnered on a large, painted elk that can be seen driving through Knappa on U.S. Highway 30 outside the Logger Restaurant.

Hockman said the question has come up whether Knappa should continue this burgeoning tradition, leaving its mark on cities across Clatsop County. “We do really like large-scale projects.”

Construction will close roads in Warrenton and Knappa next week

Next week, Perkins Road in Warrenton will be closed for construction Monday through Friday, and limited to local access. Detour to Dolphin Road.

Old Highway 30 in Knappa will be closed to heavy hauling through Friday, and limited to local access, from Waterhouse Road west to U.S. Highway 30.

Also next week, Clatsop County crews are surfacing the road on Old Highway 30 and Hillcrest Loop and brush chopping and mowing in the Brownsmead area.

The Oregon Department of Transportation continues work on the Astoria Bridge. Flaggers control single-lane traffic. Lane delays of up to 20 minutes are allowed anytime.

At Manzanita Avenue on U.S. Highway 101 (mile post 43.00 to 43.34), ODOT is replacing an existing culvert at Neahkahnie Creek with a tunnel structure, enhancing of the stream bed, and relocating and improving the highway alignment along U.S. Highway 101 near Manzanita. Also, turn-

ing lane movements into downtown Manzanita are being enhanced. Minor delays can be expected when flaggers need to occasionally control single lane traffic.

Bridge rehabilitation work is being performed at both the Old Youngs Bay and Lewis & Clark River bridges along U.S. Highway 101 Business, which is now closed until August to facilitate construction activities. A detour route is designated with signs.

The Oregon State Police enforces the speed limit through the work zone areas.
