Loggers take the lead in All-League

Not surprisingly, the teams that dominated Northwest League baseball and softball also dominated the all-league selections, announced at the league playoffs earlier this week.

Both teams combined to go 33-0 in league play this season, and both are among the favorites to win state titles in the coming weeks. The two teams also swept the NWL's Player of the Year, Pitcher of the Year and Coach of the Year awards.

In softball, league champion Knappa had eight all-league selections (over half the Logger roster).

Senior Kacie Cameron was Pitcher of the Year and Player of the Year, while James Nichols was selected as Coach of the Year.

Joining Cameron on the first team were seniors Stacey Aho and Alyson Olheiser (the only outfielder on the first team); freshman shortstop McKailyn Rogers and freshman catcher Kaitlyn Truax.

Earning honorable mention were sophomore Alisha Murphy and freshmen Jaden Miethe and Paris Vanderburg.

The Northwest All-League baseball team had 43 selections, with Knappa baseball leading the way with 10 players. Only four players on the Knappa roster did not make all-league.

Senior Andrew Miller was named the Player of the Year (unanimous), senior Chase Rusinovich was Pitcher of the Year (unanimous) and Jeff






League Player of the Year Kacie Cameron pitched all seven innings, allowing just one hit with 14 strikeouts.
