THE SHIP REPORT

Rose Festival Fleet a feast for shipwatchers

This week has been quite a feast for people who like to watch ships. That's because we've had the Rose Festival Fleet traveling on the Columbia River.

Each year in the week before the Portland Rose Festival, Lower Columbia residents can see a parade of U.S. and Canadian military ships arriving from places like Vancouver, British Columbia, and San Diego. They cruise across the Columbia River Bar, past Astoria, Longview and Vancouver, Wash., to the seawall in Portland on the Willamette River, where they're open for public tours during the Rose Festival. A few stop in Astoria along the way for a night.

I've been fortunate in past years to travel upriver on U.S. Coast Guard ships for the festival, and it's a real treat to see

the river environment from the water side of things — it looks quite different than it does when you're looking at the river from, say, U.S. Highway 30. The ships, by the way, all take marine pilots on board as they transit from the Columbia Riv-

er Bar to Portland.

Ships you may see on the river this week include Canadian Navy coastal defense ships the HMCS Saskatoon, Whitehorse and Calgary. They carry machine guns and cannons, and have minesweeping and

hunting equipment on board. Like most combat vessels, they are painted that characteristic gray color.

From the U.S. Navy, look for the USS Chosin. She is a guided missile cruiser, and has items like Tomahawk cruise missiles in her arsenal. The USS Champion is a mine-sweeping and hunting ship that is, incidentally, made of wood and fiberglass, to avoid triggering magnetic mines in her work as a minesweeper. And the U.S. Coast Guard cutter Wachee is a big, white ship in the Coast Guard fleet — she's 418 feet long, and is what's called a National Security Cutter.

But by far, the prettiest of the Rose Festival Fleet on the river this week has to be the HMCS Oriole: she's the Canadian Navy's officer cadet training vessel (akin to the U.S. Coast Guard's barque Eagle). She's used to teach young trainees how to work together.

er by operating a realio-trulio sailing vessel by hand. The Oriole is a ketch-rigged sailboat (that means two masts, with the shorter one towards the stern). She's over 100 feet long, and is a racer that's competed in lots of competitions in Canada. Best of all, she is gorgeous. Lots of varnished wood (brightwork) and teak decks to admire if you get to see her.

All the ships in the Rose Festival Fleet have courteous, kindly folks on board who love their vessels, so a tour of any of them would be a treat for enthusiastic shipwatchers.

And more good news: we'll also get to see them again next week as they head back down-river once the festival is over.

One more interesting note for Astoria ship watchers: the tall ship Lady Washington is in Astoria this week as well. Her home port is Aberdeen, Wash., and she comes to Astoria at least once a year. She's

docked at the East End Mooring Basin. You can go aboard for a sail or take a tour at the dock. For more information, check out www.historicalsea-port.org.
