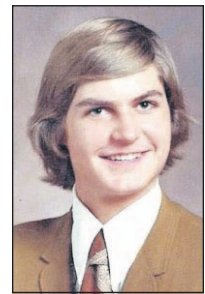
He eventually moved back to Astoria, Ore., where he got back into his love

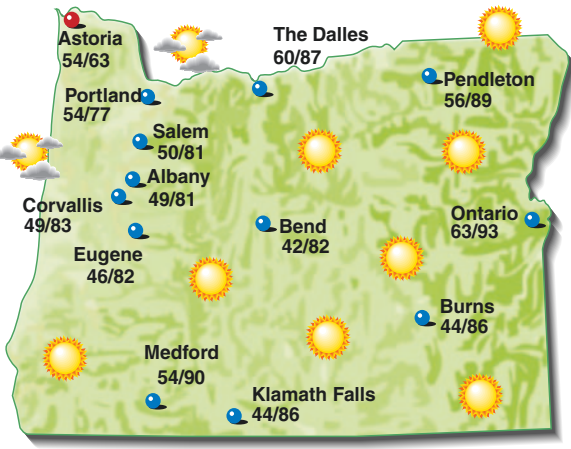

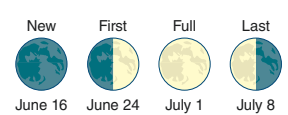

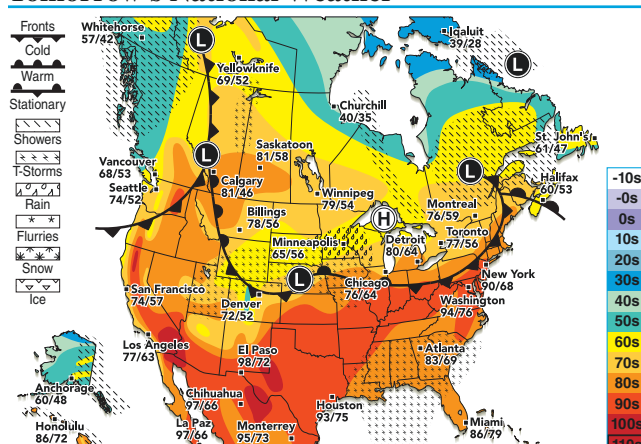
