

# Six Fishermen land all-league honors

The Astoria Fishermen led the way with six first-team selections, on the 2015 Cowapa All-League baseball team.

State champion Scappoose had five first-team players, with two honorable mention.

Astoria junior outfielder Carter Wallace was named Player of the Year, while Astoria's Dave Gasser and Scappoose coach Robert Medley were Coaches of the Year.

Wallace was joined on the first team by teammates Kai Brown (Sr., pitcher), Fridtjof Fremstad (So., shortstop), Ryker Helmersen (So., catcher), Nick Scott (Sr., outfielder) and Kyle Strange (So., third base).

Seaside's lone first team selection was senior catcher Zach Quicke.

Wallace was also named first-team on the 75-player all-state team, along with Brown and Fremstad (third team), Scott and Quicke (honorable mention).

Brown and Scott will play for the North Squad in the upcoming All-Star Series in Roseburg. League champion Clatskanie landed nine players on the Lewis & Clark All-League baseball team, announced last week.

### L & C All-League

Clatskanie senior pitcher German George was the unanimous Lewis & Clark League baseball Player of the Year, and the Tigers' Ryan Tompkins was Coach of the Year.

George was also honored as the Class 3A state Player of the Year, while Tompkins shared the Coach of the Year honor with Al

## It's sports camp time

### Volleyball

The North Coast Volleyball Camp is set for 9:30 to 11 a.m. Aug. 4-6 each day at Astoria High School.

This camp is open to all boys and girls who will be in grades 3-8 next fall. The cost is \$40 if registered by July 31; \$45 if registered after July 31.

All proceeds will benefit the AHS volleyball players and programs. Fliers will be distributed to Astoria Middle School, Lewis & Clark, and Astor elementary schools.

### Girls Basketball

The Astoria Girls Basketball Skills Clinic is Monday-Thursday at Astoria Middle School.

The camp is divided into two sessions.

For players who will be in the first through fourth grades next fall, registration is at 3:30 p.m. the first day, with the camp from 4-5:30 p.m.

For players in the fifth through eighth grades, registration is 5:30 p.m., and the camp from 6-8 p.m.

Cost of the camp is \$50 and includes a T-shirt.

Basic fundamentals will be taught by the Astoria varsity coaching staff of Mike Jacobson, Nikki Martin Jacobson, Tracie Nygaard Brockey and Marla Olstedt, plus current and former players from the area. Players do not have to attend Astoria schools to participate.

### Jordan Poyer camp

The second annual Jordan Poyer Football Camp is scheduled for 1 to 5 p.m. June 28 at CMH Field.

The Astoria High School graduate, former Oregon State All-American and current member of the Cleveland Browns, along with the Astoria High School football coaching staff, will conduct a one-day Football Camp for any child entering grades K through 8 in fall 2015.

Cost of the camp is \$40. Camp instruction will include individual techniques for all offensive, defensive and special team positions; recommended nutritional training; off-season and in-season training; the importance of goal-setting; and the importance of team-building.

Preregistration is preferred. To preregister, fill out an authorization form (available at Astoria

High School) and return to Astoria High School, 1001 West Marine Drive, to the attention of Howard Rub by Friday.

Checks should be made payable to Astoria Football — Jordan Poyer Camp.

If preregistration is not possible, campers may register the day of the camp from noon to 12:45 p.m.

Campers should wear cloth shorts and T-shirt, and preferably a rubber molded pair of shoes (metal cleats are not allowed).

### Baseball Camp

The first annual Astoria Ford Baseball Summer Day Camp takes place July 20-22 at CMH Field.

The camp is for any player in the lower Columbia region, ages 8-15. Players from Washington and all surrounding schools in the Astoria area are welcome.

Astoria Ford's Baseball Summer Day Camp will begin July 19 for all participants from 6 to 8:30 p.m.

The schedule for the remainder of the camp (Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday), is: 8- to 12-year-olds from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m. and 13-15-year-olds from 1 to 3 p.m.
