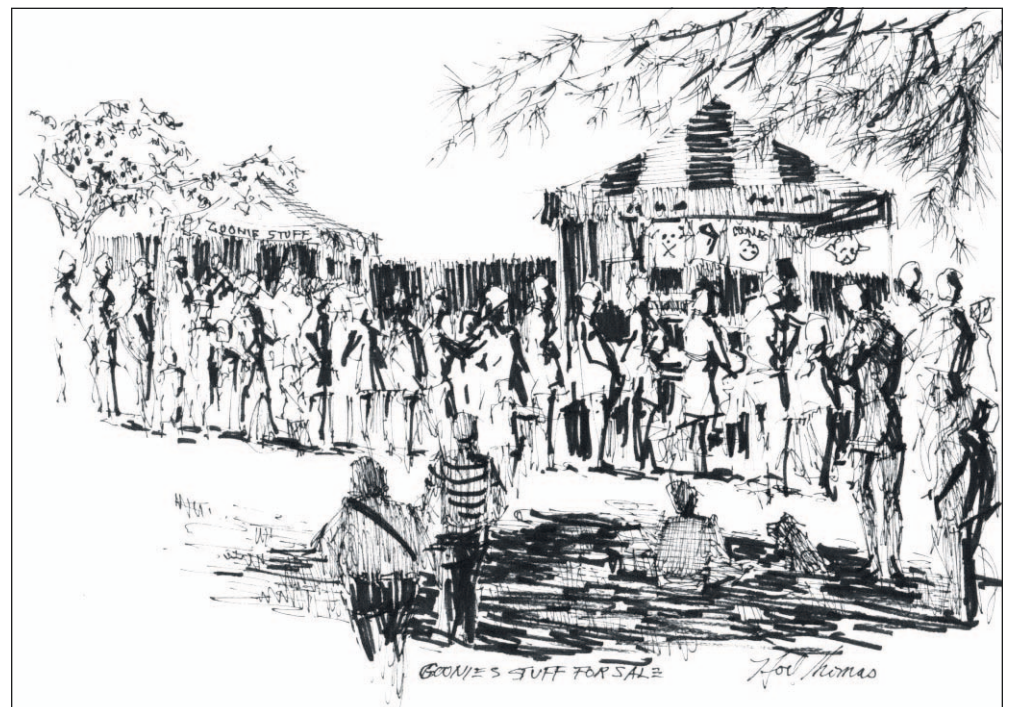
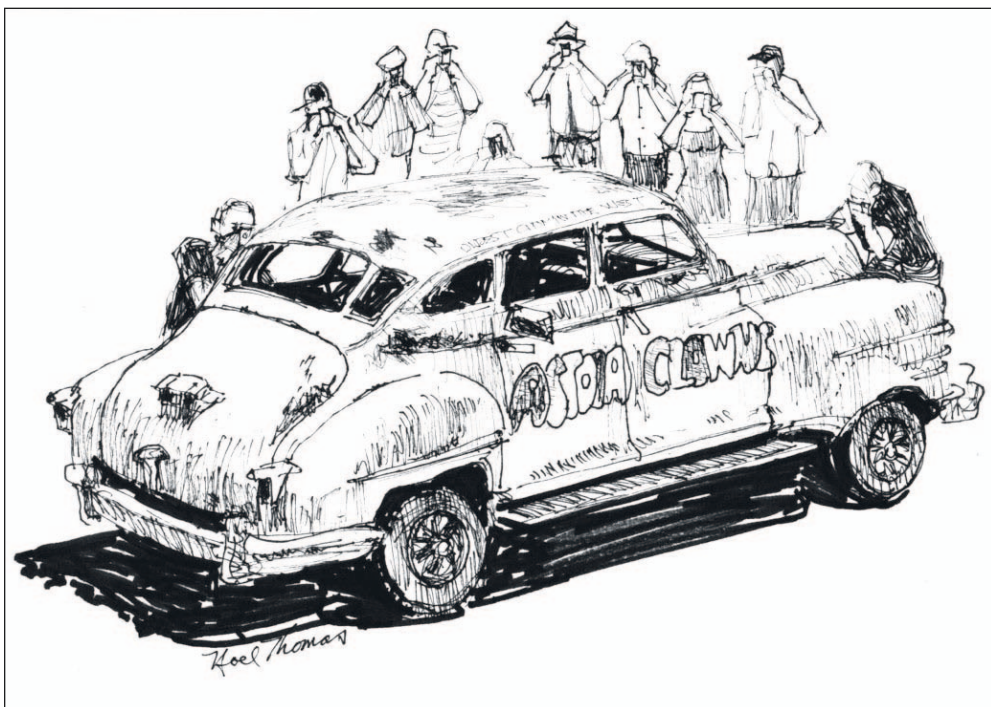
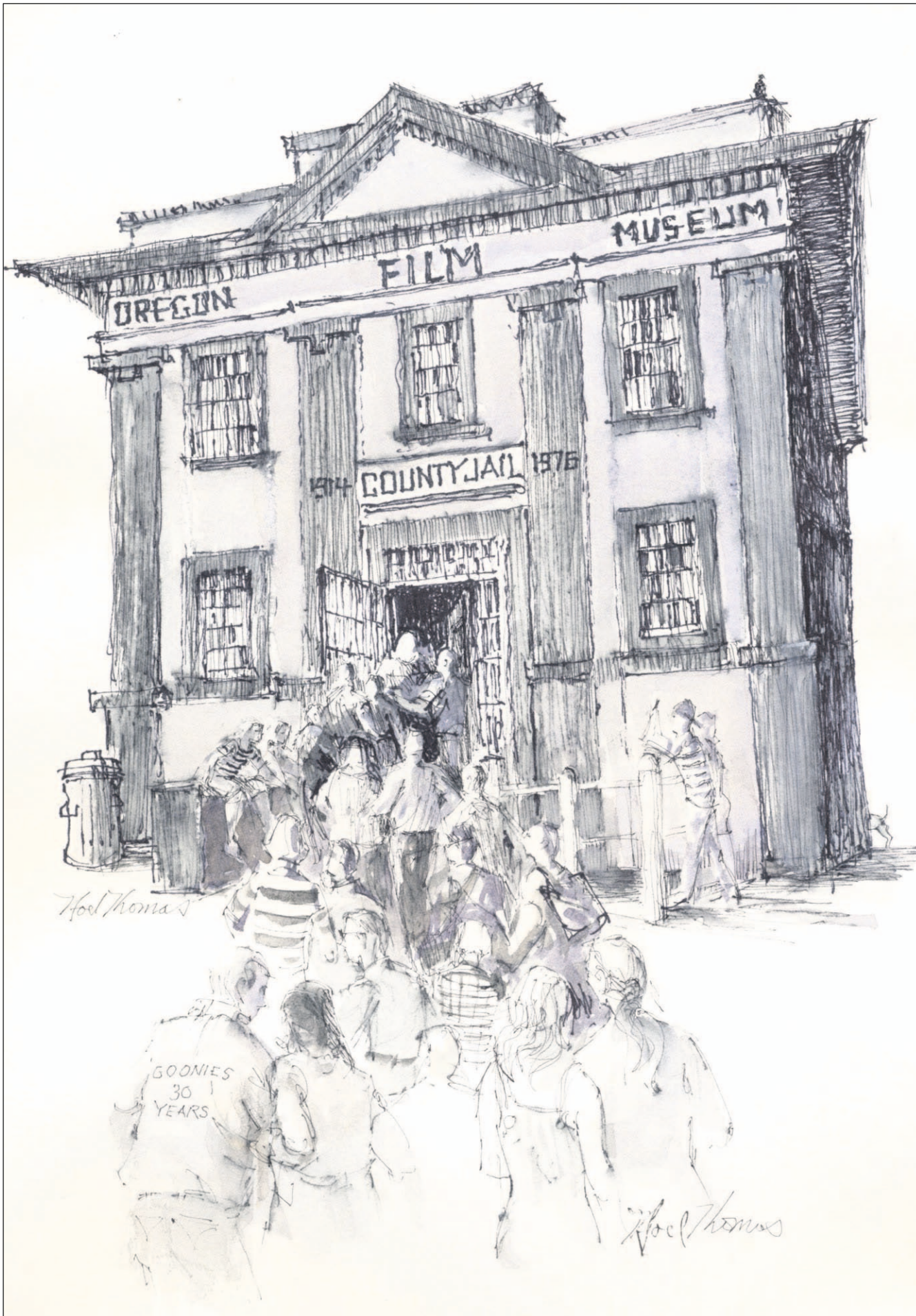
# GONE GOONIE
