OPB's 'State of Wonder' comes to Astoria

"State of Wonder," Oregon Public Broadcasting's weekly arts and culture show, will feature Astoria's cultural transformation in next week's program. A free live recording of performances and interviews with Astoria artists and community leaders is scheduled for noon Monday at the Liberty Theater.

The program will air on OPB at noon on June 20. April Baer, the show's host, will be joined by organizers and artists of the Astoria Music Festival, including conductor Keith Clark, music director and pianist Cary Lewis, Oregon Symphony Concertmaster Sarah Kwak, and renowned cellist Sergey Antonov. A live performance by Blind Pilot's Israel Nebeker, Antonov

and other string players is scheduled. Nebeker and Blind Pilot drummer Ryan Dobrowski, who is also a painter, will be interviewed. Baer is also expected to talk about the city's cultural transformation with arts advocate and Clatsop County Commissioner Sarah Nebeker, Fort George Brewery and Public House co-founder Jack Harris, painter Darren Orange, and writer Matt Love.

Finally, a run anyone can handle. Register. Show up at the start line. Take a step. Get a medal. Go to the after-party. The Instant Gratification Run, which goes off at 2 p.m. Sunday at the Astoria Riverwalk near the Barbey Maritime Center, is a fundraiser to help low-income

families with scholarships to Astoria's parks programs. The cost to enter the 0.0-mile run is \$25, or \$40 for the run and a T-shirt. Prizes will be awarded to adults with the best costumes and to random runners. "We like to say that this event is 'where runners and non-runners collide,'" one park staffer said of the idea, which is modeled after simi-

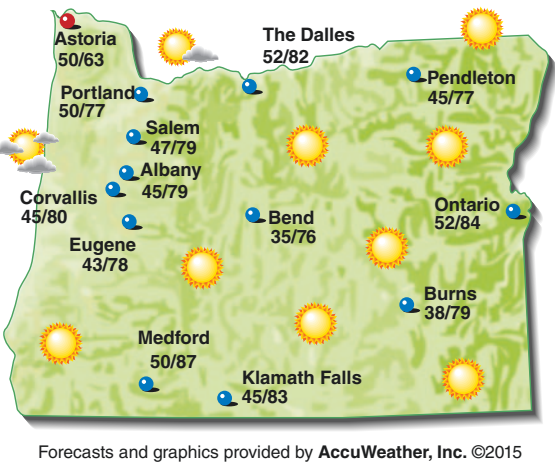

The city's Parks and Recreation Department and a nonprofit foundation have been looking at interesting ways to raise money to cover the \$35,000 the city typically awards in scholarships. The city is also sponsoring "Parks After Dark" events for adults that include movie screenings, games and beer.

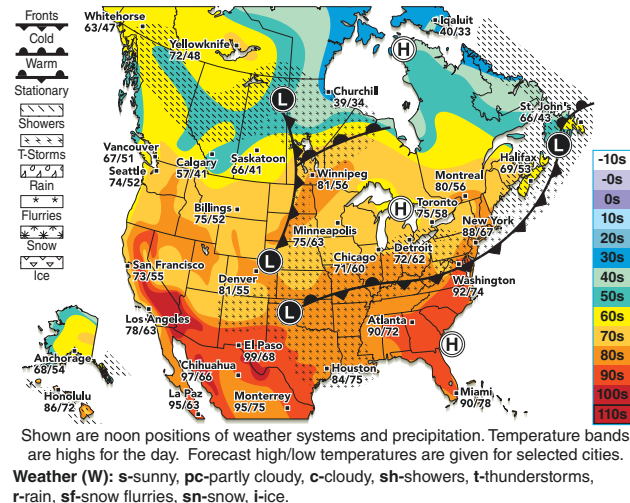

Agnes Johnson, 85, passed away Sunday, June 7, 2015, in Portland, Ore. She was born in Clatskanie, Ore., Nov. 13, 1929, to John and Edla Kurtti. Ann grew up in Clatskanie, but her family moved to Astoria her junior year of high school and she graduated from Astoria High School in 1948.

After graduation, she attended and graduated from beauty college in Portland. Ann returned to Astoria and worked as a beautician. Her beautician career spanned 12 years in various cities in which they lived.

On Sept. 6, 1952, she married Gerald "Jerry" M. Johnson in Astoria. They began their married life in Seattle, and then back to Astoria while Jerry was enlisted in the Coast Guard. Jerry's career as a controller for the Georgia Pacific Corporation required them to move the family to various states including California, New York, Connecticut and Michigan.

In the mid 1970s, they moved back to the West Coast, where they owned and operated a western store in Lebanon, Ore., called Toklat Tack & West-ernwear for over 20 years. They retired in 1995, and eventually moved back to Clatsop County.

Agnes was an excellent homemaker, wife, mom, and "grammy," great golfer, gourmet cook, seamstress and master gardener. She was able to move from home to home and have it all set up and ready to go in record time. She was involved in bridge clubs, newcomers groups, gourmet groups, and was an Altar Society volunteer.

Agnes is survived by her husband of 63 years, Gerald Johnson; daughter, Lisa Rhoads and her husband, Dan; and granddaughter, Kelsi Rhoads.

Besides her parents, she was preceded in death by her brother, Arnold Kurtti; sister, Alice Meyers; and her sons, Larry and Terry.
