## Perth brings the Heat, Astoria gets the win SCOREBOARD SPORTS SCHEDULE TO

The Astoria Ford Fishermen are still undefeated in international competition, and fans at Aiken Field were well-entertained by a night of Australian-American baseball, as the Perth Heat — a touring youth team from Western Australia — made their third visit to the North Coast.

And for the third time since 2010, the Astoria Ford summer baseball team scored a victory over the Aussies.

The two teams played Tuesday night until they got tired — which happened to be 9 1/2 innings. Astoria Ford was leading 12-1 when the game was stopped in the bottom of the 10th.

But the final score wasn't really the point of it. The game was more about some 15-, 16and 17-year-old kids from different countries getting together for a baseball game.

The teams had lunch together before the contest, and they all stuck around for a barbecue afterward, as Astoria once again put on a good show for Australia-American relations.

While the Perth team made a stop at the Goonies House and was generally impressed with the area, they were even more impressed with the baseball.

"It's getting pretty difficult at this point," said Perth infielder Matt Sproule, referring to the competition the Australians are seeing on their trip through Oregon, which included a tournament in Medford last week.


Perth has two touring teams — an older 'varsity' team, and a younger 'junior varsity' squad of mostly 15and 16-year-olds, who played Tuesday against Astoria.

Chances are, there aren't many players from Dubai, United Arab Emirates, who have played at Aiken Field. Sproule is likely the first.

"Coming from the Middle East — there's not a lot of baseball exposure there," he said. "One of the most impressive things I've seen about the

serves as one of three coaches for the younger Perth team, and said, "Baseball here is much bigger here than it is in Australia, so it's a great challenge for our guys to come out and mix it up with these guys.

"We just go out and play every day — we don't get a chance to do that much in Australia," said Barnes, who is from Texas, played baseball at Notre Dame and was drafted by the Philadelphia Phillies. He ended up playing in Canberra in the Australian Baseball League.

"A good amount of the

players are from Perth," he said. "We have some guys from Canberra, and four or five from Dubai.

"The talent is there," he added.. "We have a good amount of skill. We surprise a lot of people with the skill. It's just a matter of consistency for us, and that gets back to playing every day."

Perth's James Cappello, from Canberra, said, "The competition is good. It's hard we've played some pretty competitive teams."

As for Tuesday's game, the two teams were tied 1-1 after 3 1/2 innings, before Astoria Ford scored three runs in the bottom of the fourth and one in the fifth. Cade O'Brien and Jackson

Arnsdorf had run-scoring singles, and O'Brien stole home to highlight the fourth.
