

In 1963 the Hendrickson family moved to Southern California, where they remained for the rest of their working years. Following retirement, they moved back up to Washington state to be near their grandchildren and other family members. She and Arnold returned to Riverside, Calif., following the birth of Emily. She has resided for the last two years in Bellevue, Wash.


Nov. 2, 1931 — July 6, 2015


