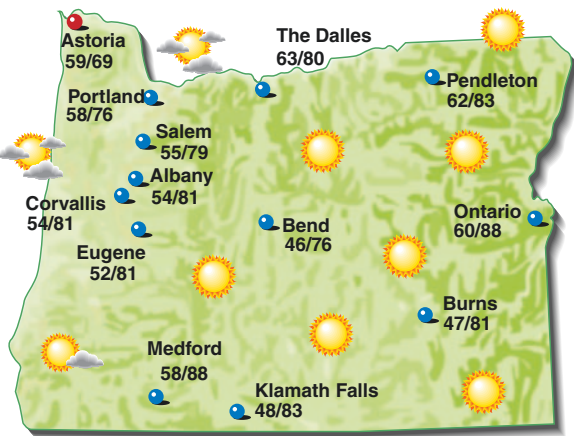

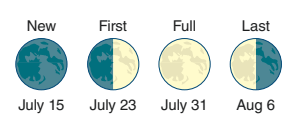

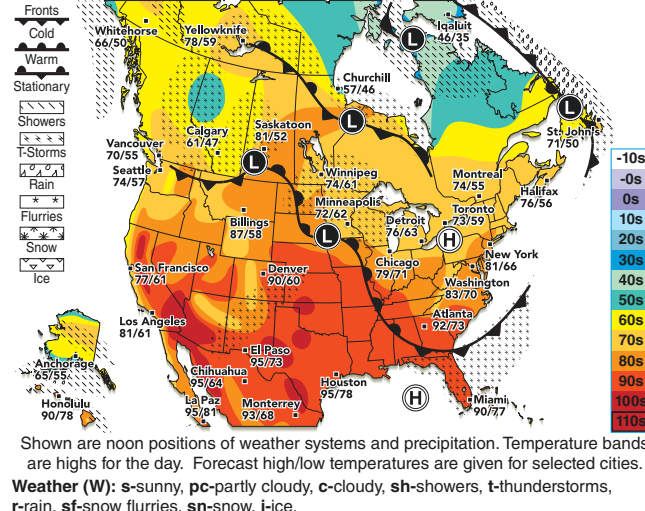

She was preceded in death by both of her parents and her beloved brother, James Edmonson, who passed away in 2013. Together, the two of them were known for many pranks and laughs.

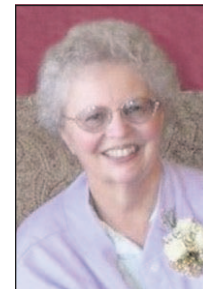
Gwen was known for her strong will, which allowed her to overcome adversities which would have felled others, such as polio when she was a teenager. She graduated from the College of Great
