

Fishermen split with Gresham in last stand at home

Astoria Ford team looks to fourth state title

The Astoria Ford baseball team overcame five errors to win Game 1 8-5, but Gresham — an American Legion team sponsored by Advanced Metal — banged out 11 hits in Game 2 for a 7-6 win, as the two teams split a doubleheader Saturday afternoon at Aiken Field.

It was Astoria's last home appearance before this week's Junior State tournament, Thursday through Sunday at Western Oregon University and Crescent Valley High School.

Astoria Ford will open against Dallas, at 5 p.m. Thursday.

"We're playing really well, especially when we can get into a rhythm of playing baseball for a few days in a row," said Astoria Ford coach Chris Wright. "We have a lot of young kids who are playing a ton of innings, and they're really coming on."

Astoria Ford nearly let a 5-0 lead slip away in Saturday's opener, as the Fishermen committed four errors in Gresham's four-run fourth inning.

Astoria pitchers Fridtjof Fremstad and Tyler Lyngstad were able to close out the win.

Astoria Ford scored three runs in the first inning on a bases-loaded walk; a sacrifice fly from Lyngstad that score Fremstad; and Nick Scott sprinted home on a first-and-third steal attempt.

A double by Carter Wal-

lace, a triple by Fremstad and a single by Scott helped Astoria score two runs in the third; and Scott delivered a triple to deep right field in the fifth that scored Cade O'Brien with Astoria's final run.

Fremstad and Lyngstad combined to strike out five batters with one walk, with six hits allowed.

Fremstad made two outstanding plays at shortstop in the seventh inning, fielding a grounder bare-handed to start a 6-3-5 double play, then made a diving stop on another grounder for the final out.

Astoria Ford scored first in Game 2 (a single by Lyngstad that scored Wallace in the first inning), but the next six runs belonged to Gresham, which scored four in the top of the fifth.

Astoria answered right back, as run-scoring singles by Wallace and Scott, a bases-loaded walk to Lyngstad, and a two-run-single from Jackson Arnsdorf tied the game at 6-6.

Gresham's Brett Falkner and Kyle Wells had back-to-back singles in the top of the seventh, and the go-ahead run scored on a balk call.

The Fishermen had two runners on base when the final out was recorded in the bottom of the seventh.

Gresham left nine runners on base, and Astoria Ford stranded 10.

Astoria Ford will be seeking its fourth state championship in the Junior State tournament. The Fishermen won titles in 2006, 2007 and 2009.

Astoria's Kyle Strange and Samboy Tuimato missed Saturday's action, but are expected to return for the tournament.

Other medalists from a weekend of qualifying included James Folk, who shot a 1-under par 71 in the Junior/Seniors Division; and Mike Graham won a tie-breaker to take the top spot for the Super Seniors with a 76.

Eight-time OCI champion Lara Mack Tennant fired a 77 for the best qualifying score in the Women's Division.

Match play starts today in the Grand Champions and Junior/Seniors divisions, and action continues every day through Saturday at the Astoria Golf & Country Club.
